ONLY BURN LOCAL OR CERTIFIED FIREWOOD

Help stop the spread of forest pests in Tennessee.

Our forests are threatened by nonnative insects and diseases that can kill large numbers of trees. Firewood can be a home to these destructive organisms. New infestations can start if you take firewood with you when you travel. Help to protect your trees, forests, and communities from the threat of invasive species.

How you can help stop the spread of forest pests in Tennessee:

- Leave firewood at home - don't transport it to campgrounds or parks.
- Use firewood from local sources near where you're going to burn it, or purchase state or federally certified firewood.
- If you have moved firewood, burn all of it before leaving your campsite.
- Tell your friends not to move firewood. Remind them that in quarantined Tennessee counties it is illegal to move firewood.
