The formation of this cinder cone less than 1,000 years ago profoundly affected the land and its people.

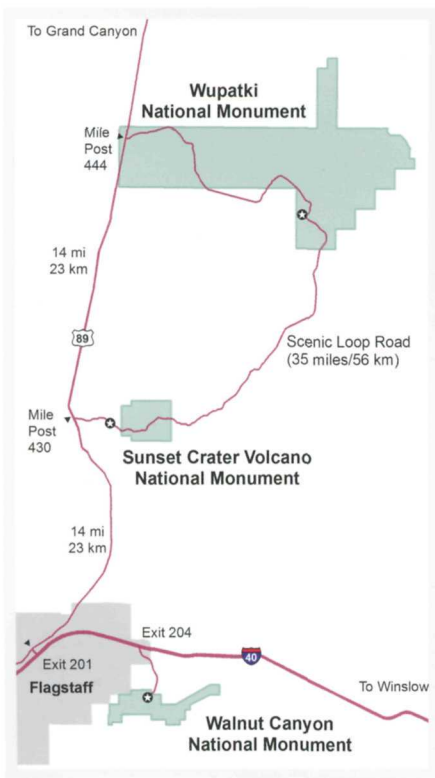


## Wupatki
