Coronado National Memorial

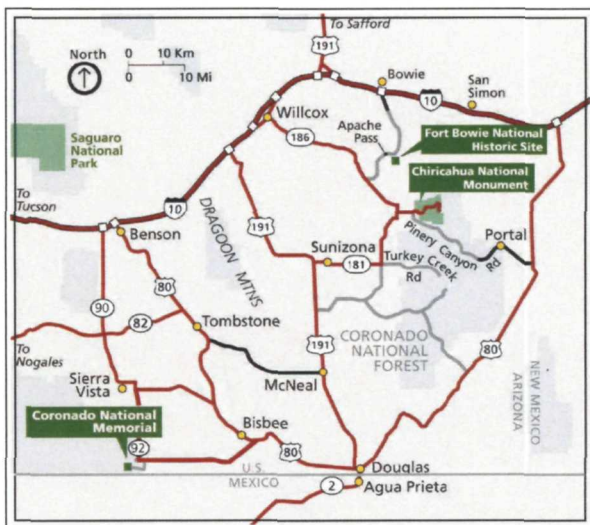
The Coronado Expedition first entered what is now the United States in 1540. Learn about the Spanish history of the Southwest and explore the borderlands.

1.5 miles to the visitor center and
ruins.
