MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Welcome to the convenience of campground reservations. We believe you will enjoy being able to make reservations, so that a campsite is waiting when you visit the parks listed in this brochure. Please take a few moments to acquaint yourself with the procedures for making a reservation through the MISTIX system. We think that your camping experience will be much more pleasant if you plan ahead and know what to expect. We'll be looking forward to seeing you.

RESERVATION PROCEDURES

During the camping season, you may make reservations for the campgrounds listed in this brochure. Reservations may be made no sooner than eight weeks in advance, and up to the day before your planned arrival. Because of the heavy demand and the time needed for processing, we encourage you to plan ahead and make your reservations early. Some campgrounds on the system are very popular, requiring reservations to be made as far in advance as possible. Following are the instructions for making your reservation.

In Person: You may make a reservation in person at any MISTIX outlet or at any park on the reservation system no later than the day before the reservation begins. You may also make your reservation at National Park Service information offices in Washington D.C., Atlanta, Denver, Phoenix and Agoura Hills, California. Have your reservation application filled out in advance to insure faster service.

By Mail: If you wish to reserve by mail, complete the form in this brochure and mail it to MISTIX at the address shown so that it arrives at least three weeks before you plan to start your trip. You must have your reservation ticket when you check in. The National Park Service or MISTIX cannot be responsible for delays in mail service. Tickets will not be mailed to temporary addresses. While tickets may be purchased at a park if space is available, no tickets for reservations made by mail will be held at a park for pickup on arrival. Visa, Mastercard, Discover, Personal Checks or Money Orders are accepted for mail orders. MISTIX does not accept overnight deliveries on Saturdays and Sundays.

By Telephone: Reservations are available by telephone for all national park areas listed in this brochure from 7 A.M. to 6 P.M. Pacific Time, 7 days a week. Visa, Mastercard, Discover, and personal checks are accepted. For all parks call:

Phone reservations made within 10 days of arrival will be held at the campground, all others will be mailed.

Tickets: When you receive your reservation ticket, examine it immediately and verify that it is for the campground, arrival date and number of nights that you desire. If not, immediately obtain a corrected ticket from the outlet operator, return it to the mail reservation address, or phone the number at which you made the reservation. If you mail your ticket, be sure that you copy the information on the front, including the validation number, in case you need to refer to it in future correspondence. Lost tickets cannot be replaced or refunded.

TWO RESERVATIONS ARE ALLOWED PER CUSTOMER FOR SAME DATES IN SAME PARK! (2 site limit does not apply at Ozark Riverways, Death Valley and Joshua Tree's Black Rock Canyon campgrounds only.)

About Your Applications: Be sure that the application form is filled in completely and accurately. Incomplete forms will be returned without a reservation being made. Reservations are made for a particular park and campground, but specific campsites cannot be reserved. Many campgrounds are filled well in advance, so we suggest that you indicate alternate campgrounds and dates whenever possible. Your request will be returned unfilled if the exact dates specified cannot be reserved, unless you authorize MISTIX to reserve a shorter or different period. Campsite assignments are made when you arrive based on the type of equipment you show on the form.

CHARGES: There is a daily charge for the use of each campsite as shown on the campground list. This charge does not include the daily entrance fee which is charged as you enter many parks. In family campgrounds, U.S. residents, who are 62 years of age or older possessing a valid *Golden Age Passport* and individuals who are permanently disabled possessing a *Golden Access Passport* are entitled to a 50 percent reduction in the daily charge. *Golden Age* or *Golden Access Passports* must be presented to the MISTIX outlet operator, the passport number shown on the mail request or given to the Telephone Reservation Operator at the time of reservation to obtain the reduction in the daily campground charge. *Golden Age* or *Golden Access Passports* must be in possession while occupying campsite; there is a limit of one campsite per card holder.

Golden Eagle Passports and *Park Passes* provide for free entry into the parks, but do not provide a reduction in camping charges.

LENGTHS OF STAY: Limits on lengths of stay apply at all sites. Please check listing. Multiple reservations which exceed the limit shown in this brochure will not be honored and could result in a violation of park regulations.

NUMBER OF PERSONS: Individual campsites are for use by one family (parents with dependent children) or a party of no more than six persons. Larger organized groups should contact the Park Superintendent for information on reserving a group campsite. A separate brochure is available for parks with group campsites on the MISTIX Reservation System.

ARRIVALS: When you arrive at a campground, present your ticket to the person on duty. If campground personnel are not on duty when you arrive, campsite assignments will be posted at the entrance to the campground.

LATE ARRIVALS: Reservations will be held for late arrival for the first night of your reserved time, unless the Park is notified. If you do not arrive by 8:00 AM of the next day, and have not notified the Ranger of late arrival, your entire reservation will be cancelled and made available for another camper. Use phone number printed on your reservation ticket.

PETS: No extra charge for pets. See Special Information Section on other side for specific park pet policy.

CHECK-OUT TIME: 12:00 noon or as posted. Campers cannot be assured of space before check-out time.

CAMPSITE INFORMATION: Campgrounds on the reservation system have water systems, toilets, fireplaces, tables and parking spaces. Utility hookups are not available. Please be sure to show full overall length of camper, motorhome or trailer on your reservation application. If you have extra equipment, such as a boat trailer, be sure to show it. Campsite reservations are made to accommodate your equipment. There is a limit of one motorized vehicle per site.

Sites with wheelchair access for the disabled are available at all parks on the system except Rocky Mountain and Cape Hatteras. At Yosemite, such sites are available only at lower Pines Campground.

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY
EARLY CANCELLATION
(Received not later than 8:00 AM on the day before the date of arrival)

REFUNDS
To be processed for a refund, the unused camping ticket must be mailed to: MISTIX Customer Service at the above address. All cancellations will be subject to a cancellation fee which will be deducted from the refund. The minimum cancellation fee is \$10.00, with an additional fee of one night's camping fee charged in instances where cancellation notification is received after 8:00 AM on the day before the reserved arrival date.

EARLY DEPARTURES
To be eligible for a refund, the camper must notify the campground office before checkout time on the day of early departure and must obtain a refund voucher. A cancellation fee of \$10.00 will be deducted from the camping fees for the unused nights. The refund voucher may be left at the campground office or mailed to MISTIX Customer Service.

ENJOY SAFE VACATION
Each year a number of park visitors are injured or killed because they engage in activities which are more hazardous than they appear. We want you to have a good time, and we know that your safety is a big factor in a successful vacation. So, our message is this: **DON'T TAKE CHANCES!** Talk to a Ranger before you journey off the trails or try some new activity. For your protection and the protection of the park, we draw your attention to a few important safety tips and regulations:

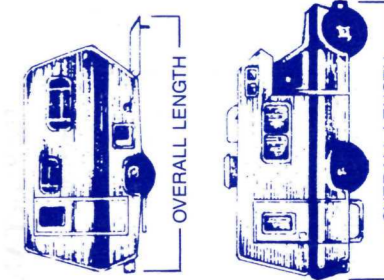
- Camping is permitted only in designated campgrounds. Please don't set up your camp in a place not designated for this use.
- Build fires only in the fireplace or grill provided.
- Pets, where permitted, must be on a leash no more than 6 feet in length, and may not be left tied and unattended. Pets are not permitted on most trails.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM, or as posted on the campground bulletin board.
- In parks where bears are present the Superintendent may designate areas where food must be stored to prevent its loss. Check with the Ranger or write the Superintendent in advance. Never feed or approach any wild animal.
- Limited parking is available in many campgrounds. If you have extra vehicles or are towing a trailer, parking space may not be available.
- Swimming and water sports can be hazardous in surf or mountain streams. Swim with a buddy, and respect the forces of nature. Use lifeguard protected areas when available. Talk with a ranger for information.
- The gathering of firewood is permitted only in certain areas and is subject to conditions established by the Superintendent. Check with the Ranger first.
