What is a World Heritage Site?

It's a place selected by the United Nations (UNESCO) to be protected and preserved based on its outstanding universal value. Outstanding universal value means that it is important to the world!

There are over 1,000 World Heritage Sites around the world and each one has their own features that make them have outstanding value to humanity. The United States has 24 World Heritage Sites and 18 of those are units of the National Park Service.

San Antonio Missions

The missions are Spanish colonial communities from the 1700s. Throughout San Antonio you can see a blending of cultures represented in the housing, farmfields, fresco paintings, churches, and more. Even after hundreds of years these are still imporant places for the community, traditions and culture.

What makes these missions have outstanding universal value? The structures, the blending of cultures, and the continuity of traditions.

Structures

Many of the stone structures around the park are more than 200 years old, but some of them are incomplete now and are "ruins". These structures would have been houses, workshops, storage rooms, and even churches like the unfinished church at Mission San Juan.
