American history lives in Gettysburg National Military Park. From battlefield weapons and artifacts on display in the Museum of the Civil War to the best marked battlefield in the world, the park is a sort of monument to a time referred to as the "High Water Mark of the Confederacy." An astounding 51,000 casualties were suffered during the Battle of Gettysburg, more than any other battle on North American soil.

Both self-guided and park-guided tours of the battlefield are available.
