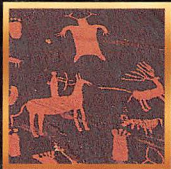

PETROGLYPH NATIONAL MONUMENT

ALBUQUERQUE,
NEW MEXICO

Seventeen miles of steep volcanic cliffs hold the key to 12,000 years of man's existence on Albuquerque's West Mesa. Prehistoric and historic petroglyphs and rock art carvings - more than 15,000 in all - tell of the life experiences of these early Native American and Hispanic communities.

The Boca Negra Unit, formerly called Indian Petroglyph State Park, allows visitors a self-guided tour of the fascinating Indian petroglyphs. And for viewing the monument's more remote canyons, park rangers will conduct informative tours for visiting groups.

SPECIAL INFORMATION
