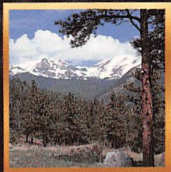

ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK

ESTES PARK, COLORADO

With 78 peaks, each more than 12,000 feet high, Rocky Mountain National Park has no shortage of lofty scenery. The mountains, after all, are the main attraction among the 265,726 acres of parkland straddling the Continental Divide. Colorado's state flower, the blue columbine, flourishes at nearly every elevation.

The bighorn sheep, the symbol of the Rocky Mountains, inhabit the upper elevations. Other wildlife, including beavers, mountain lions, marmots and mule deer, live amid lush subalpine valleys, shimmering lakes and wildflower meadows.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Request information on hiking, fishing, horseback riding, mountaineering and ranger-led tours from the park superintendent. Be cautious of extreme changes in elevation and temperature.
