San Juan National Historic Site is comprised of three major 16th-century fortifications originally designed to protect Spain's dominion in the New World. The visitors centers are within Fort San Cristobal which serves as site headquarters, and Fort El Morro. The third fort, Fort El Canuelo on Isla de Cabras, is just off San Juan Bay's western shore.

On a harbor stroll from El Morro, visitors will encounter the City Walls and La Fortaleza, the fortress and palace occupied by the governors of Puerto Rico for more than four centuries.

Other attractions near the forts include San Juan Cathedral, Museo de las Americas, V Centennial Plaza, and Casa Blanca, estate of Ponce de Leon.
