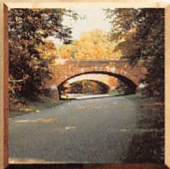

## COLONIAL NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

VIRGINIA

Colonial National Historical Park administers two of the most historically significant sites in English North America: the first permanent English settlement at Jamestown in 1607 and the final major battle of the American Revolutionary War at Yorktown in 1781, literally the beginning and end of English Colonial America. Situated on the Virginia Peninsula, these sites are connected by the 23 mile scenic Colonial Parkway. Colonial NHP also includes the Cape Henry Memorial, which marks the approximate site of the landing of the Jamestown colonists and overlooks the site of the decisive Battle of the Capes fought in September of 1781 preceding the siege of Yorktown.

### **SPECIAL INFORMATION**
