Pea Ridge National Military Park is a 4,300 acre Civil War Battlefield that preserves the site of the March 1862 battle that saved Missouri for the Union. On March 7-8, 1862, over 20,000 troops locked horns on this site. The Elkhorn Tavern, site of bitter fighting on both days, is a National Park Service reconstruction on the site of the original. The park represents one of the best preserved Civil War battlefields in the country.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

The park features an 11 mile equestrian trail and a 10 mile hiking trail. On the self guiding auto tour, there is a 7 mile paved tour road with 10 stops.
