





Established as parkland October 4, 1961, Piscataway Park stretches for 6 miles from Piscataway Creek to Marshall Hall on the Potomac River. Through the use of easements to protect parklands from obtrusive urban expansion, Piscataway Park preserves the Potomac River view as it was during George Washington's day.
