The park's Visitor Center is open Wednesday through Sunday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Come stand face to face with the convention organizers at "The First Wave" statue exhibit, explore the interactive exhibit area, and view "Dreams of Equality", a dramatization of the First Women's Rights Convention in 1848.

Ranger guided tours step off from the Visitor Center at 10:30 am and 1:30 pm to explore the Wesleyan Chapel, where the women's rights movement had its formal beginnings, and concludes at the Elizabeth Cady Stanton House. Join us for all or part of these 90 minute programs.

On Saturdays & Sundays, the M'Clintock House is open in neighboring Waterloo, NY from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm. Explore the home of a Quaker family that hosted the planning meeting for the Seneca Falls Women's Rights Convention.
