The period of the roads construction is 1913-1920. The first workers were convicts, but the task was completed by a contractor. Although the original Fall River Road began at Horseshoe Park on the east side and dropped over the divide at Fall River Pass to the upper Colorado River, only a portion of the route comprises what is considered the Fall River Road. This is the length of road beginning at Endovalley and ending at the crest of the pass-approximately 9.4 miles of narrow, gravelled road. The portions of the road leading up to Endovalley have been substantially altered, while those running down the western slope were incorporated into the later built Trail Ridge Road. When it was completed in 1920

the road averaged 8-10 feet in width and had grades of up to fifteen percent. Closed by a rock slide in 1953, it was re-opened as a one-way-up motor nature trail in 1968.

Aside from the numerous switchbacks, no significant historical features exist along the route of the road. Modern gabions have been installed on some of these switchbacks to prevent erosion of the mountainside.
