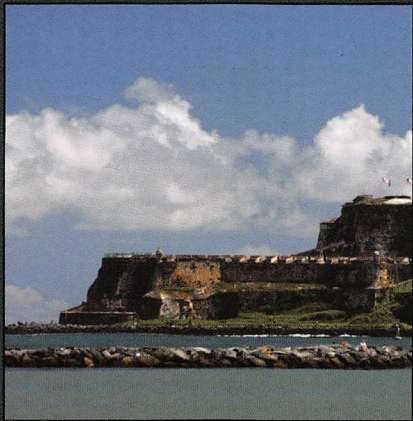

EL MORRO NATIONAL MONUMENT

Castillo San Felipe del Morro (named after King Phillip II of Spain) is a 16th-century citadel that lies on the northwestern-most point of the capital of Puerto Rico, San Juan. It is more commonly known as 'El Morro' and was designed to defend San Juan Bay. In 1983 the castillo was declared a World Heritage Site by the United Nations. It receives several million visitors annually.
