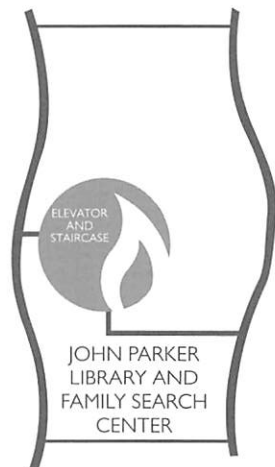
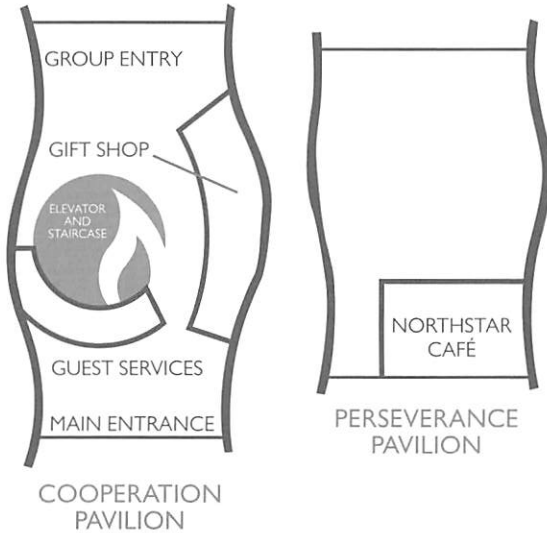

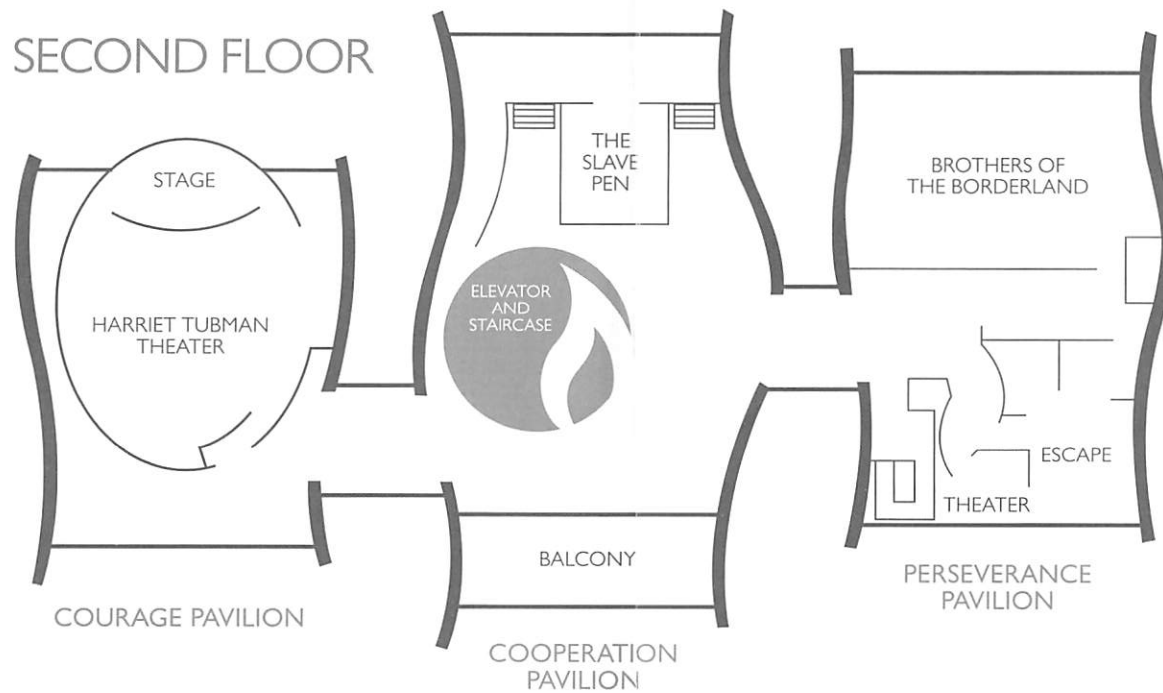

An original structure found on a farm in Kentucky and rebuilt here, the building temporarily housed slaves on their way south to be sold.

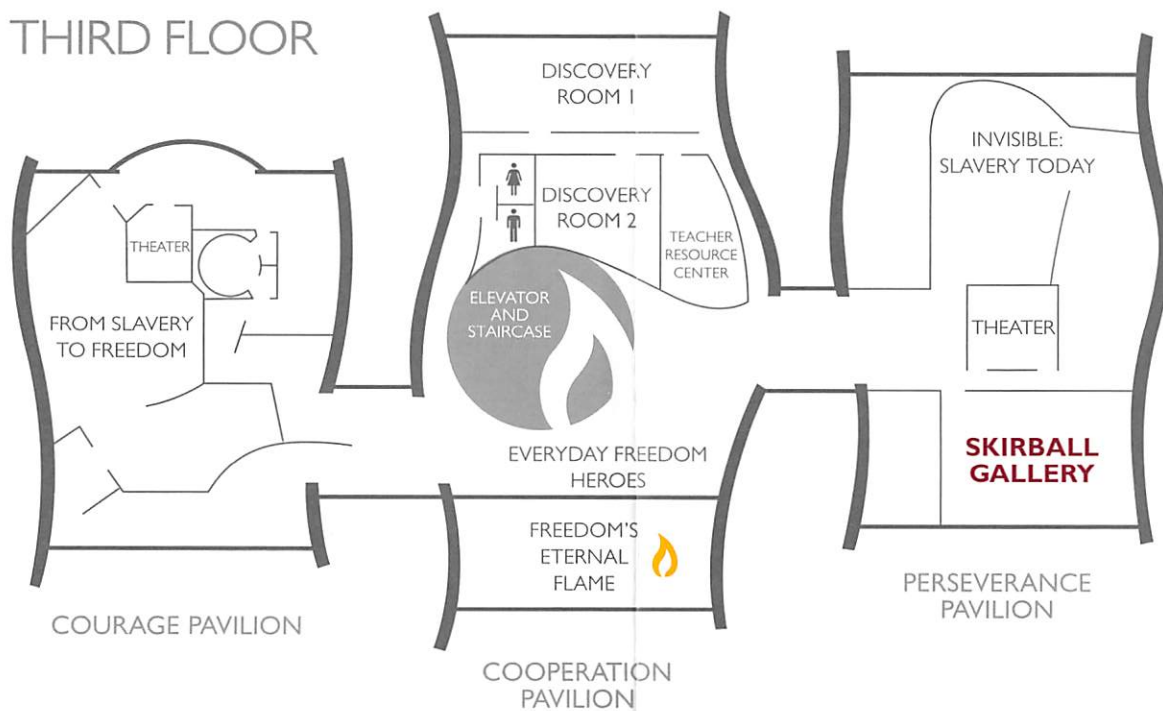
ESCAPE
