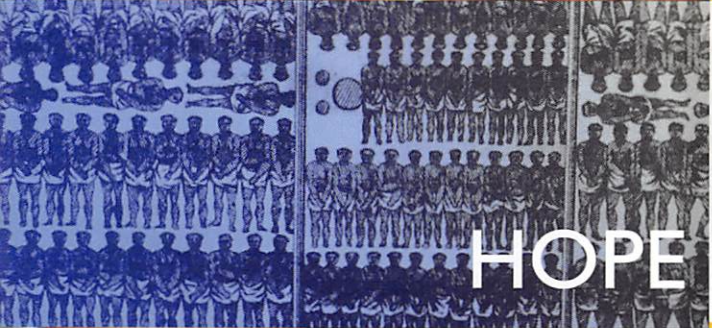
HISTORY
