Blind & Posey Islands



Blind and Posey Islands are managed cooperatively by the San Juan Islands National Monument and Washington State Parks. Both islands offer campsites dedicated to boaters arriving by human- or wind-powered watercraft and are designated sites along the Cascadia Marine Trail.

Blind Island is a three-acre island north of Shaw Island, just west of the Shaw ferry terminal. Posey Island is about one acre and is located north of Pearl Island, near Roche Harbor.



KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- The campsites on Blind and Posey are open year-round. All sites are first-come, first-served.
- WA State Parks collects fees on both islands; pay by envelope at the kiosk on site.
- There is no fresh water available on site. Pack out everything you pack in.

ACCESS

- **Blind Island:** approach from the northeast to avoid an extensive reef on the northwest side of the island. Look for mooring buoys on the south side of Blind Bay and a rocky landing on the west side of the island.
- **Posey Island:** approach from the southeast for a beach landing. Watch for the rocks to the east of the island and check the tide charts before leaving your boat!
