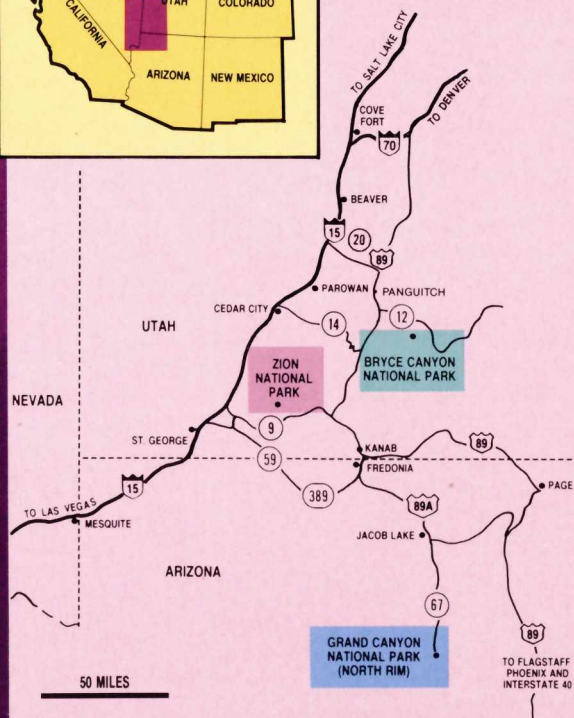

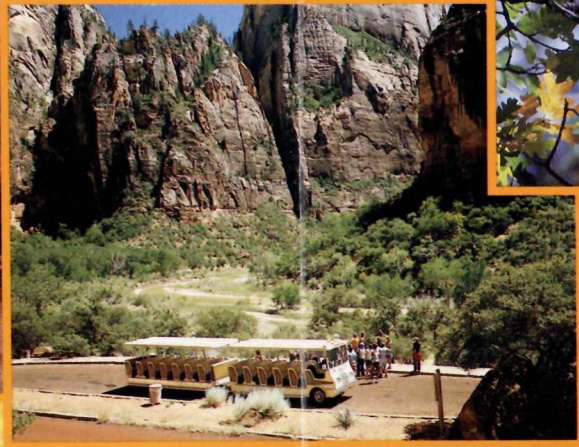
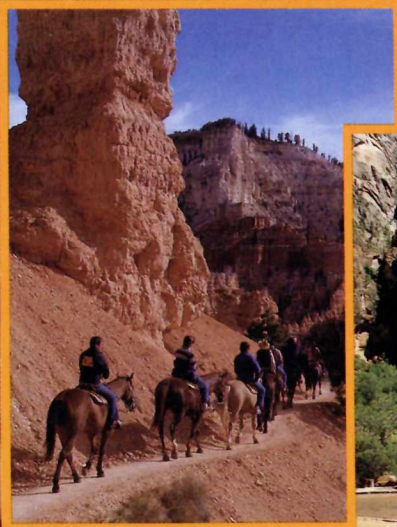

Sanctuary for the Spirit

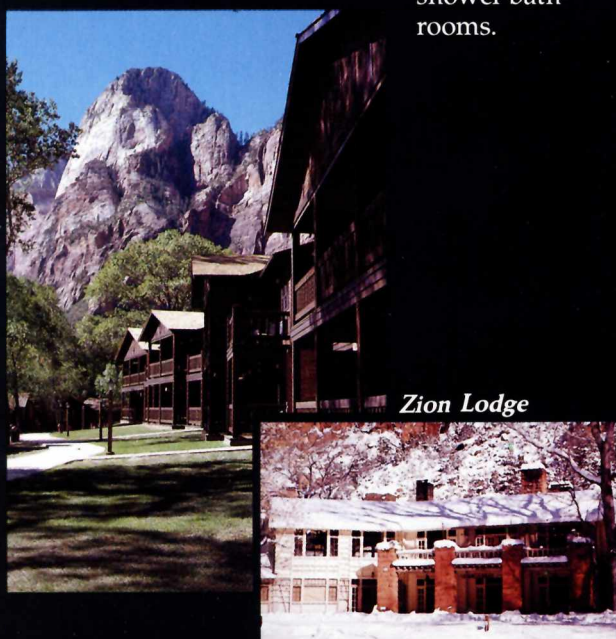
A choice of accommodations inside all three national parks places a world of natural splendor and outdoor excitement right at your doorstep. Modern building interiors harmonize with natural exteriors to complement the park environment. Rustic elegance, to relax and revive.

Western Cabins. These deluxe retreats blend charm with the unforgettable faces of the canyons. Cabins feature phone, fireplace,

two double beds, carpeting, private porches and a full bath. Available in all three parks.

Frontier Cabins (North Rim Only). These rustic cabins are only a short walk from the canyon rim. They feature a double bed and single bed, carpeting and shower bathroom.

Pioneer Cabins (North Rim Only). Offering privacy plus convenience to the main lodge, Pioneer Cabins house one double bed and three single beds, carpeting and shower bathrooms.

Motel Rooms. Bryce and Zion units feature two queen-size beds, full bath, phone and private porch. North Rim units offer double beds and shower bathrooms.

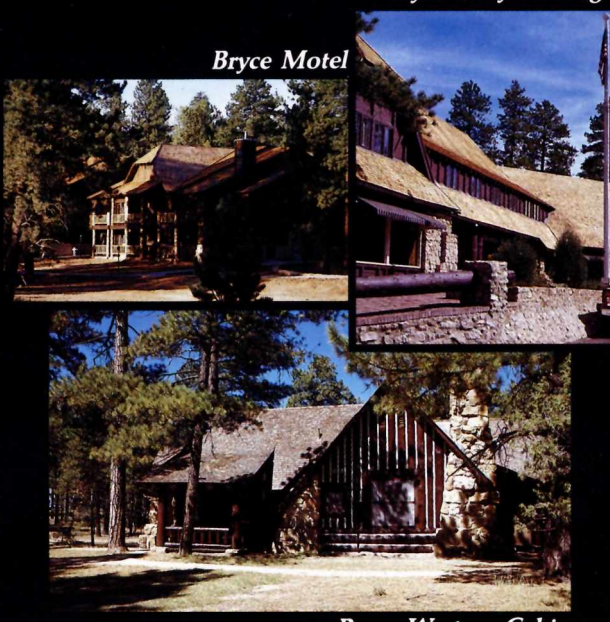

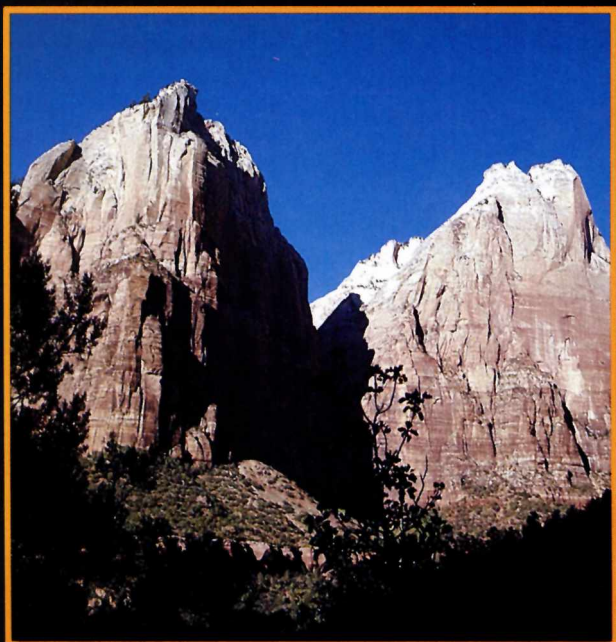

Zion is the paradox of opposites in harmony — the pairing of harshness and serenity — that inspires.

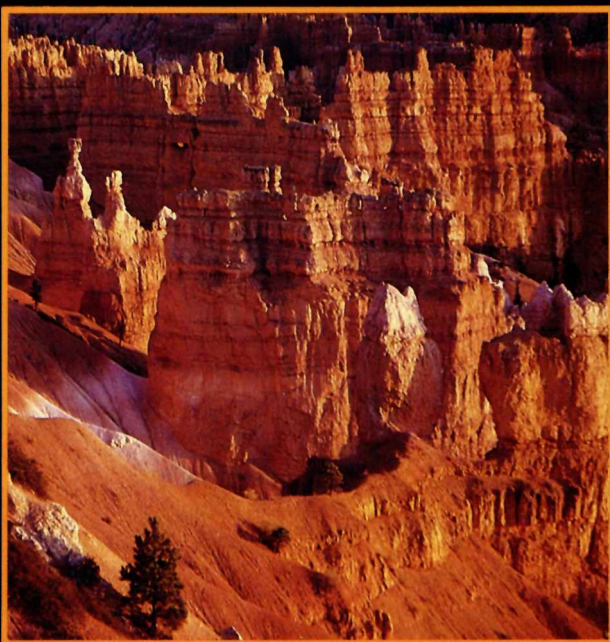
