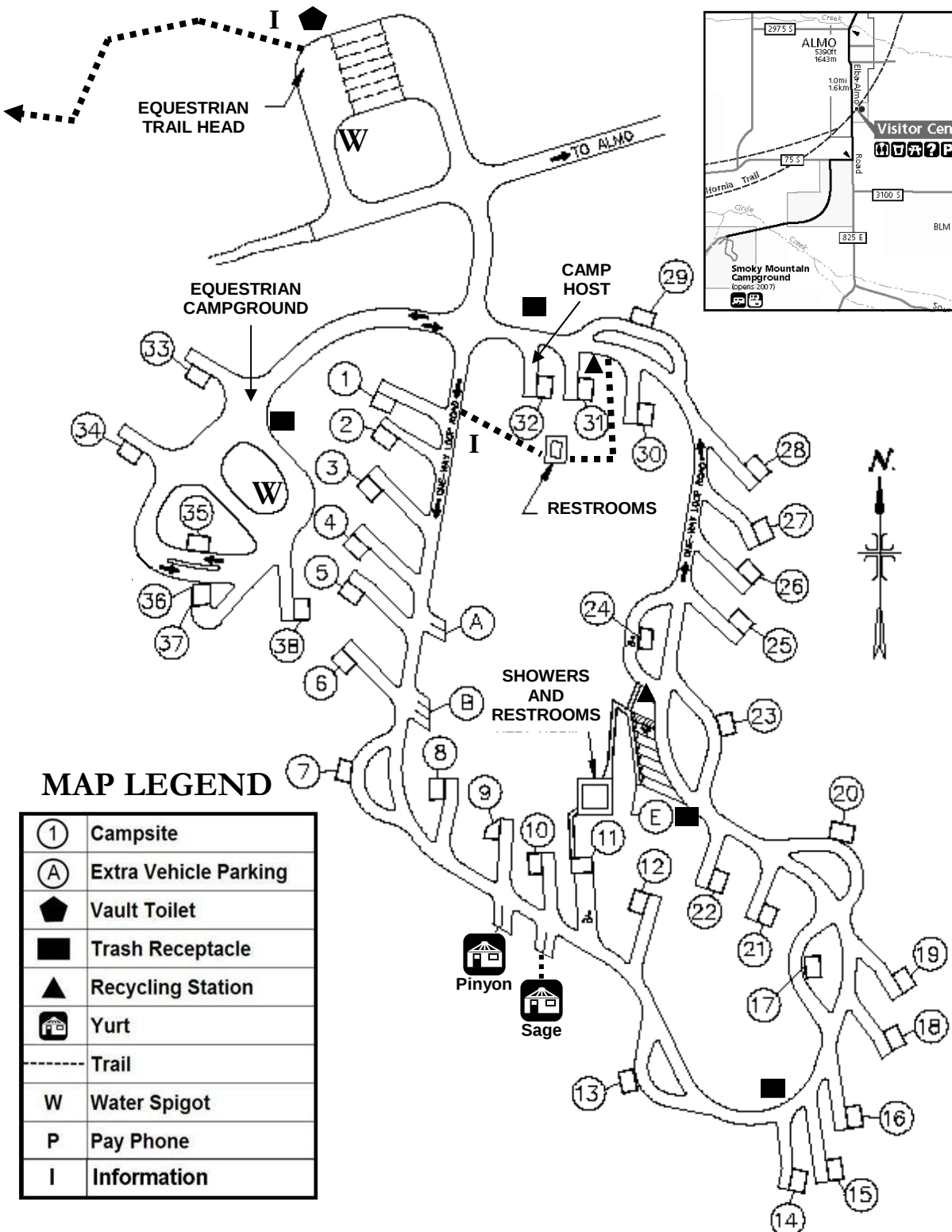
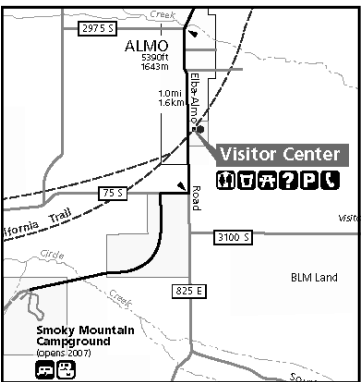
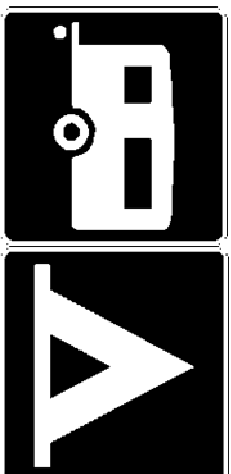

RV CAMPSITES

Smoky Mountain Campground offers 38 sites. Sites 1-31 are general campsites. Sites 11 and 24 are designated ADA accessible. Sites 33-38 are designated for equestrian campers. The camp host is located at Site 32. Each campsite is equipped with 30 amp electrical service, water service, partial shade, picnic tables, vehicle pads, and is pet friendly. Smoky Mountain also features an RV dump station. Recycling stations are located near the shower house and Site 31. Sites 36 and 37 are designed to accommodate a small group and share a picnic table and fire ring.

RESTROOMS & SHOWERS

Three restrooms are available at Smoky Mountain. Flush toilets are available May 1 to Sep. 30, in the shower building and the building located behind the camp host site. A vault toilet is available year round at the equestrian trail head. The shower facility is located in the center of the campground. It is available for a \$3.00 fee (plus sales tax) to day-use visitors with paid Day Use Vehicle Entrance Fee receipt or annual pass. Overnight guests to City of Rocks must pay the entrance fee to use Castle Rocks State Park facilities.

RULES

Please pay fees at entrance station. Walk-in campers pay for one night only. Length of stay is limited to 15 days in any 30-day period. Pets must be on leash at all times outside of a tent or vehicle. Firewood may be available for purchase at the camp host site or in Almo. Please use established campsite and fire rings only. Quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. A maximum of 8 people, 2 vehicles, and 2 tents per individual campsite are permitted.

VEHICLE ENTRANCE FEE

The Day Use Vehicle Entrance Fee is a daily charge for motorized vehicles. The \$5 fee is charged when a vehicle enters a designated state park area for the day. The fee is the same regardless of how many people are in the vehicle. Visitors entering an Idaho state park without a motorized vehicle do not pay. Day use is defined as "use of any non-camping lands and/or facilities between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. unless otherwise posted."

EQUESTRIAN CAMPERS

Please help us maintain the scenic quality and natural resources of the campground by adhering to the following:

Do not tie stock directly to a tree. Use the Corral provided, or a hitch line.

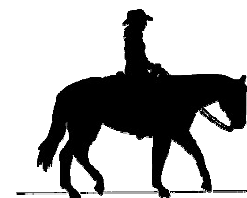
Do not take stock animals through the main camping loop.

Use weed-free hay or pellets.

Please remove manure and excess hay from sites. A storage bin is provided for proper disposal. Carry a tool to scatter remaining hay or waste, and to smooth out the area of impact for the equestrian camper.

If possible, use pellets in lieu of hay or suspend hay in netting from hitch line.

Keep horses away from potable water spigots and electrical pedestals.
