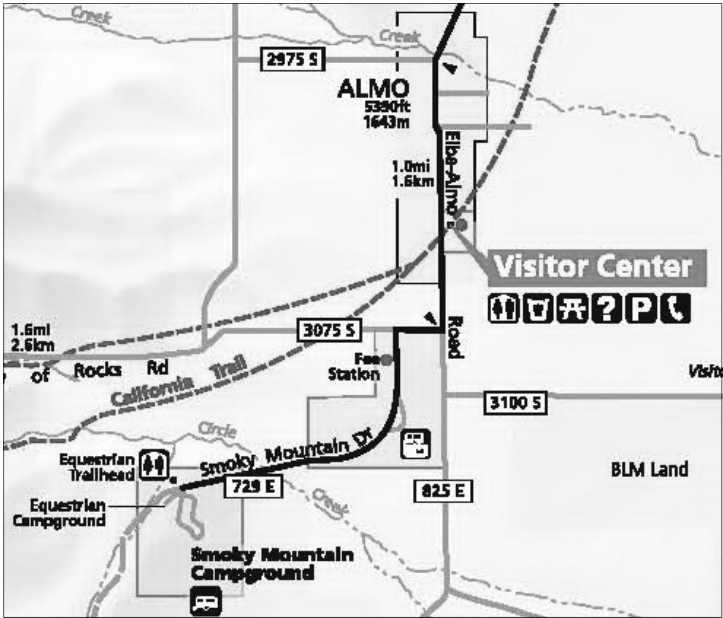
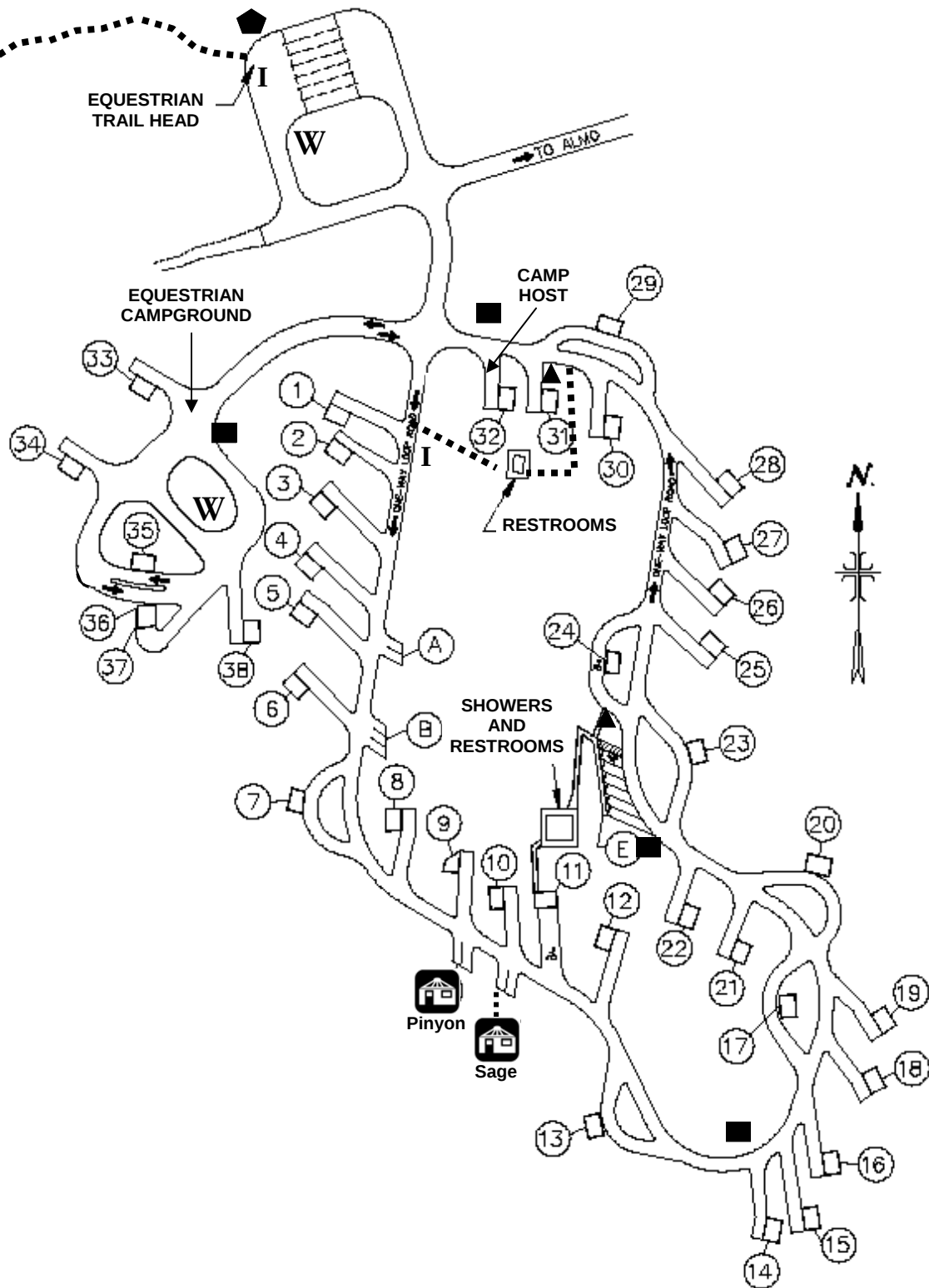

RV CAMPSITES

Smoky Mountain Campground offers 38 sites. Sites 1-31 are general campsites. Sites 11 and 24 are designated ADA accessible. Sites 33-38 are designated for equestrian campers. The camp host is located at Site 32. Each campsite is equipped with 30 amp electrical service, water service, partial shade, picnic tables, vehicle pads, and is pet friendly. Smoky Mountain also features an RV dump station. Recycling stations are located near the shower house and Site 31. Sites 36 and 37 are designed to accommodate a small group and share a picnic table and fire ring.

RESTROOMS & SHOWERS

Three restrooms are available at Smoky Mountain. Flush toilets are available May 1 through the first week in October (weather permitting), in the shower building and the building located behind the camp host site. A vault toilet is available year round at the equestrian trail head. The shower facility is located in the center of the campground and is included in the camping fee. It is available for a \$3.00 fee to day-use visitors with paid Motor Vehicle Entrance Fee receipt, parks passport or annual pass. Overnight guests to City of Rocks must pay all applicable fees to use Castle Rocks State Park facilities.

MVEF

(Motor Vehicle Entrance Fee)

Campers will be required to pay the \$5 per day, per vehicle state park motor vehicle entrance fee (MVEF) in addition to the camping fee and yurt fee unless they have an Idaho State Parks Passport or Annual Motor Vehicle Entrance Sticker for Out-of-State visitors.



EQUESTRIAN CAMPERS

Please help us maintain the scenic quality and natural resources of the campground by adhering to the following:

Do not tie stock directly to a tree or hitch line. A 12 X 12 foot corral is provided at each site (2 horses maximum). The community corral holds 1 to 3 horses.

Do not take stock through the main camping loop.

Use weed-free hay or pellets and if possible suspend hay in a hay net.

Please remove manure and excess hay from sites. A storage bin is provided for proper disposal. Carry a tool to scatter remaining hay or waste and to smooth out the area of impact.

Keep horses away from potable water spigots and electrical pedestals.

RULES

Please pay fees at entrance station. Walk-in campers pay for one night only. Length of stay is limited to 15 days in any 30-day period. Pets must be on leash at all times outside of a RV, tent or vehicle. Firewood may be available for purchase in Almo. Please use established campsite and fire rings only. Quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. A maximum of eight people, two vehicles, one camping unit (RV) and two tents per individual campsite are permitted, provided all equipment is associated with the same immediate family. See "Rules and Regulations" at the fee station kiosk.
