THE FORT LARNED OLD GUARD

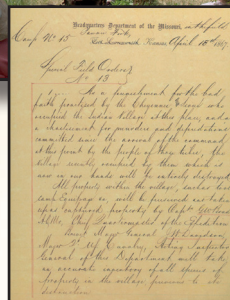
FORT LARNED was a key military post in the development of our nation's westward expansion. It was built to protect the mail and freighting routes along the Santa Fe Trail. From 1859 to 1878, it played a key role in Indian / White relationships. Today it is one of the best-preserved Indian Wars forts in the United States.

THE FORT LARNED OLD GUARD was established in 1988 as a 501(c)(3) organization. Its mission is to assist Fort Larned National Historic Site in restoring, preserving, developing, and interpreting the Fort's cultural, historical, and natural resources for the benefit of the public and posterity.

The Fort Larned Old Guard will assist in the development and presentation of special events and other efforts to preserve and interpret Fort Larned's cultural and military history.



- Purchased an important Cheyenne Indian Village Site destroyed by General Winfield S. Hancock and Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer northwest of Fort Larned. FLOG also purchased the original written orders to destroy the village.



- Purchased an engraved military sword once owned by two-time Medal of Honor winner, Frank D. Baldwin, who served at Fort Larned.



- Purchased a 3rd Infantry-marked 1866 Trapdoor Springfield 2nd Allin Conversion.

FLOG HOSTS MESS & MUSTER. An annual occurrence typically held the last Saturday in April. This unique event features living history, educational programs, and an annual business meeting.
