

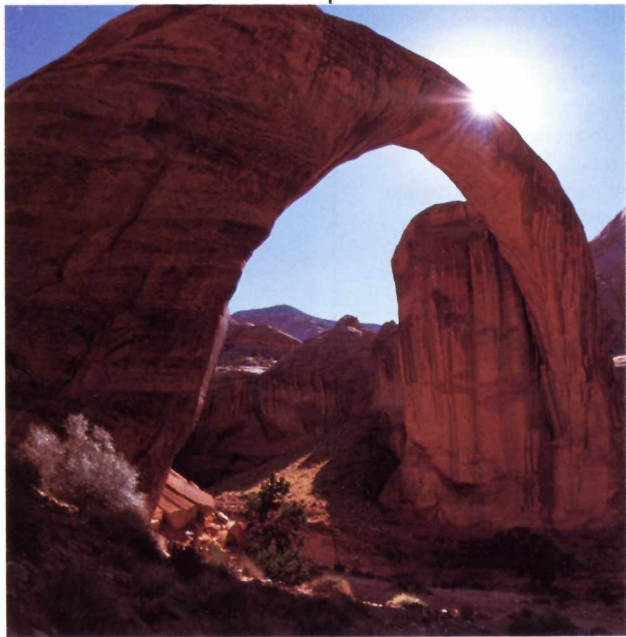

RAINBOW EXPLORER

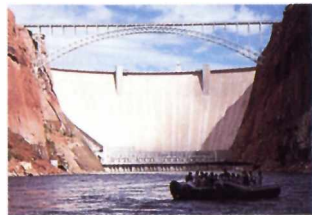
All-Day

Rainbow Bridge National Monument — world's tallest stone bridge — has been called one of the seven natural wonders of the world. Many don't consider a Lake Powell visit complete without seeing this spectacle, so impressive it was named a national monument less than a year after discovery in 1909.

Our all-day, 100-mile guided tour from Wahweap and Bullfrog includes time to hike approximately one mile (round trip) to photograph this famous attraction, as well as explore one or more major canyons. Also included: lunch and 2 nights' lodging.



Departs 9 a.m. from Wahweap, 8 a.m. from Bullfrog. Bullfrog departures in Budget season with groups only.



Half-Day

The Half-Day Rainbow Explorer Package includes 2 nights at Wahweap Lodge and a half-day guided cruise to Rainbow Bridge.

Tours leave 7:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. (from 11/1 – 3/31, 10:00 a.m.).

COLORADO COMBO EXPLORER

An opportunity to see Lake Powell and the river that carved the canyon.



Experience the last remaining stretch of what John Wesley Powell called Glen Canyon. Our half-day, 15-mile Colorado River float trip from Glen Canyon Dam to historic Lee's Ferry features a stop to examine Anasazi petroglyphs. Our all-day guided cruise to exciting Rainbow Bridge National Monument includes lunch. Also included are 3 nights at Wahweap Lodge overlooking Lake Powell.

Float trips depart from Wilderness River Adventures, 50 South Lake Powell Blvd., Page — 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. May–September and 11 a.m. February 15–April 30 and October 1–November 15.

FAMOUS MONUMENTS EXPLORER – LAND, SEA & AIR

Nowhere else on earth are there rock formations like the magnificent monuments you'll witness from the air, land and water on this thrill-packed adventure package. An all-day guided cruise provides views into many of Lake Powell's 96 major canyons, climaxed by a hike to world-famous Rainbow Bridge. A two-hour ground tour of Monument Valley places you amidst the monolithic splendor made famous in John Ford/John Wayne movies; also, you'll experience the Navajos and their culture — rug weaving, sheep herding, hogans.

Lake Powell and Monument Valley are photographers' dreams. But save film for the exciting Lake

Powell Air Service flights to view both attractions over land so rugged it was the last in the U.S. to be mapped. Includes 3 nights at Wahweap Lodge. 6-passenger minimum.

HOUSEBOAT/LODGING EXPLORER

This Explorer Package gives you two days of houseboating for the price of one. Includes: 1 night's lodging (one room, or one housekeeping unit at Hall's Crossing and Hite) or 2 nights RV space, and 2 days of houseboating with check-out at 8:00 a.m. and check-in at 2:00 p.m.

Now you can afford to schedule that fishing trip or family getaway you've been talking about. Ideal for mini-vacations, long weekends and for those who want to "try out" Lake Powell houseboating.

POWERBOAT/LODGING EXPLORER

Ideal for fishermen and families who want to explore or fish Lake Powell by day, yet enjoy the comforts of indoor lodging and "catered" dining (at Wahweap and Bullfrog). Includes two lodging nights. Boat rental begins at opening of marina and ends one hour before closing. Check marina for schedule and complete paperwork the previous day, if possible. Lodging at Hall's Crossing and Hite is in a housekeeping unit.

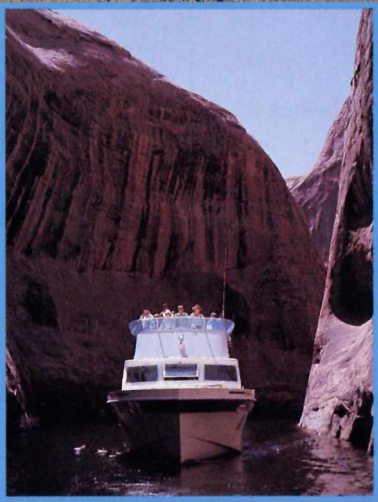

NATIONAL PARK SERVICE ACTIVITIES

The National Park Service (NPS) oversees Glen Canyon National Recreation Area (GCNRA), more than a million acres of incredibly diverse and beautiful land – land so rugged, it was the last in the U.S. to be mapped.

Lake Powell is often called the "jewel" of this vast panorama.



Carl Hayden Visitor Center

GCNRA exhibits and interpretive NPS personnel are found in two major locations:

Carl Hayden Visitor Center
Two miles north of Page, AZ.

NPS exhibits here share the spotlight with huge Glen Canyon Dam and its self-guided tours.

Chief exhibit is a large-scale relief map of the entire area. Films shown daily. Children enjoy dinosaur footprints extracted from the canyon floor.

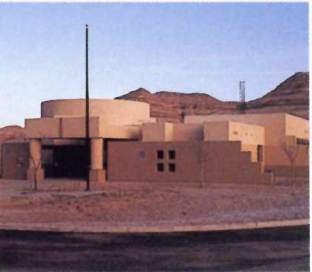
Bullfrog Visitor Center
On Utah 276, adjacent to Bullfrog Resort & Marina.

Exhibits, developed around a geologic theme, include a re-creation of a dramatic slot canyon unique to the Colorado Plateau and an exhibit depicting evolution of Glen Canyon plant and animal life from the Ice Age. Photography of the scenic beauty of Glen Canyon is also exhibited.
