SCENIC FLOAT TRIP — 10.5 River Miles

May 13 through October 1

Welcome aboard a comfortable rubber raft and settle back while we explore the Snake River with one of our experienced guides. Great views of the Tetons, occasional moose or elk, as well as osprey and eagles — bring your camera. Vans provide transportation from either Colter Bay Village or Jackson Lake Lodge for morning and afternoon daily departures.

Departs from Jackson Lake Lodge at a wonderful time of day to see wildlife such as beaver and playful otter. The Boatmen serve a piping hot supper and coffee brewed over the campfire at a beautiful site near Deadman's Bar. Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday trips. Afternoon departure.

Park visitors and guests are invited to use all facilities of the Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis Club. This is an 18-hole, par 72 championship course with six Plexicushion tennis courts. Casual dining is available for lunch and dinner at the Strutting Grouse Restaurant. The clubhouse is located just off Highway #89, eight miles north of Jackson. The small Western town of Jackson offers a variety of activities — art galleries and museums, old-time saloons and Western melodramas. Teton Village has a tram ride with marvelous views of Jackson Hole.

SO EASY TO GET THERE

BY AUTO: Four major highways serve Jackson Hole: U.S. Nos. 26, 89, 187 and 287.

BY AIR: Daily air service from Denver, Colorado and Salt Lake City, Utah, to Jackson Hole Airport. Airport transportation provided by Grand Teton Lodge Co. Call for schedules. \$10.00 per person, one way (does not include Park entrance fee).

BY BUS: Direct bus lines operated from Grand Teton Lodge Company facilities to Jackson, Wyoming.

Grand Teton Lodge Company, an authorized concessionaire of the National Park Service, operates Jackson Lake Lodge, Jenny Lake Lodge, and Colter Bay Village, within Grand Teton National Park. It also operates the Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis Club outside of the Park. COLTER BAY MARINA AND TACKLE SHOP

The Colter Bay Marina is located near the Visitors Center and just across the road from the Chuckwagon Restaurant. This is a full-service marina with fishing licenses, tackle, bait, film, snacks, fuel and rental buoys available. The National Park Service provides a free boat launch ramp. Scenic Lake Cruise

Late May through Mid September

One and a half hour narrated scenic cruises on Jackson Lake describing the formation of the Teton Mountain Range and fire policy in the National Park, departing regularly throughout the day from Colter Bay Marina. Sunset cruises to the base of Waterfalls Canyon — June through August.

Departs from the marina to Elk Island in the center of Jackson Lake. A delicious breakfast of scrambled eggs, trout and hash browns is served to provide a unique out-of-doors experience.
