

SPECIAL SCENIC TRIPS: A wide variety of sightseeing activities awaits your visit—from narrated cruises on Jackson Lake, including a special breakfast cruise leaving from Pelican Bay Marina, to luncheon at the TRAVEL/HOLIDAY AWARD winning Jenny Lake Lodge (reservations required). A visit to the Indian Arts Museum at Colter Bay or an all-day trip to Yellowstone are available.

FISHING: The clear, cold lakes and streams of the Grand Teton National Park shelter scrappy Cutthroat, Mackinaw, and German Brown trout. Trolling rods and lures are furnished on guided trips on Jackson Lake. Bring your flycasting and spincasting tackle for fishing on the Snake River. Guides for hire and rental equipment also available.

TRAIL RIDES: Experience a bit of the old West on a breakfast ride awarded with the tantalizing aromas of ham, eggs and hot coffee. Or a morning jaunt that gives lunch the look of a meal you've never really appreciated before. For an afternoon of serenity and beauty, take the wagon ride on a country road between Jackson Lake Lodge and Colter Bay Village. Enjoy evening horseback or wagon rides to a campfire where you roast marshmallows and wieners.

RAFTING DOWN THE RIVER: Board a comfortable rubber raft and take a leisurely short or long scenic trip along the meandering Snake River. The scenery's perfect for sightseers and cameramen. The trip is a wonderful way to get acquainted with Grand Teton land.

OUTSIDE THE PARK: Park visitors and guests are invited to use all facilities of the Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis. Casual dining is available for Sunday Brunch, lunch, and dinner at the Strutting Grouse Restaurant. The clubhouse is located just off Highway #89, eight miles north of Jackson. This is an 18-hole, par 72 championship course. The small Western town of Jackson offers a variety of activities—art galleries and museums, old-time saloons, Western melodramas, and rodeos. Teton Village has a tram ride with marvelous views of Jackson Hole.

WHAT TO WEAR: Dress informal at all times, with the emphasis on comfort. Days are usually warm, so have light-weight sportswear with you. A sturdy pair of walking shoes or hiking boots, denim trousers, and bathing suits will add to your comfort and enjoyment. In short, plan for an active outdoor life. Nights are cool, so warm clothing is desirable. In the Lodges, jackets and ties are optional, many guests preferring the comfort of lumberjack shirts and slacks. The mountain sun burns fast through the thinner air, so bring your suntan lotion along and a beautiful tan will result.

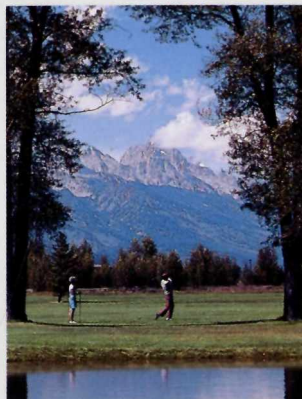

SO EASY TO GET THERE

BY AUTO: Four major highways serve Jackson Hole: U.S. Nos. 26, 89, 187 and 287.

BY AIR: Daily air service from Denver and Western Airlines from Salt Lake City, Utah, to Jackson Hole Airport. Grand Teton Lodge Company transportation meets scheduled flights (fee charged).

BY BUS: Direct bus lines operated from Grand Teton Lodge Company facilities to Jackson, Wyoming. Yellowstone Park buses connect Jackson Lake Lodge with points in Yellowstone National Park.

Reservations:

Definite reservations should be made as early as possible and accompanied by a one night's deposit. Jackson Lake Lodge and Colter Bay Village deposits will be refunded if notice of cancellation is received 48 hours prior to arrival.

Three nights' deposit is required for Jenny Lake Lodge reservations and will be refunded provided notice of cancellation is received three weeks prior to arrival.

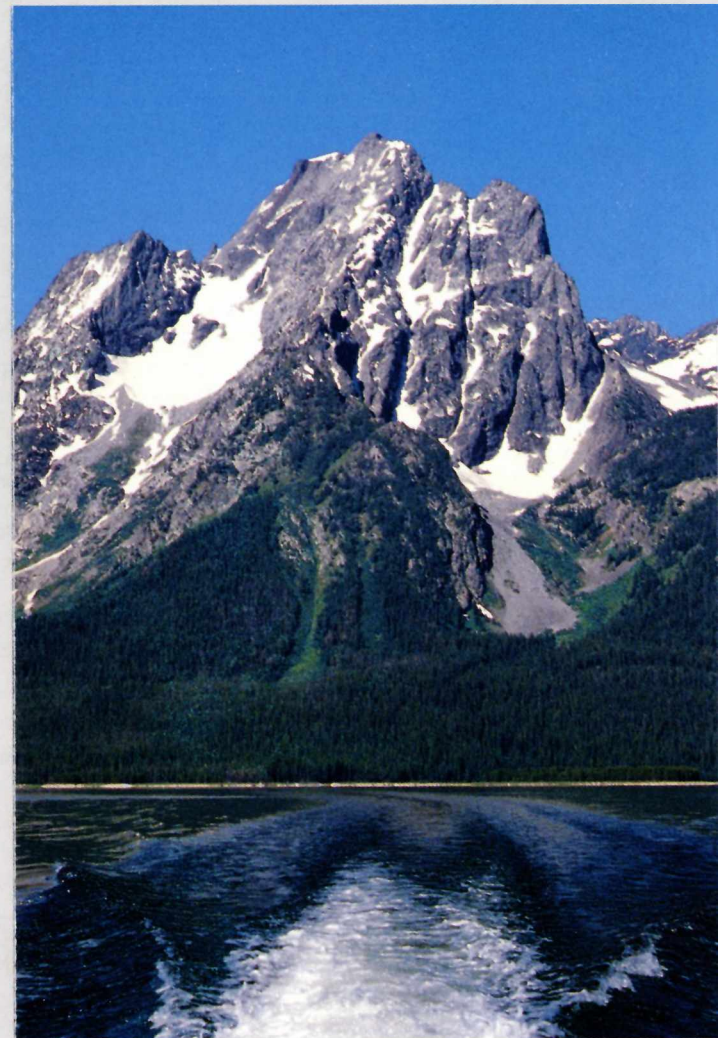
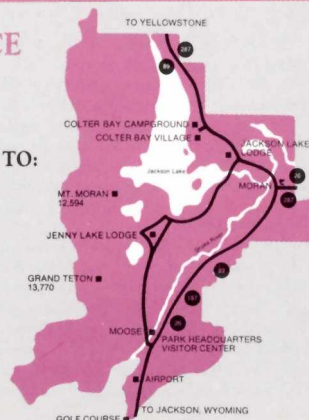

Jackson Lake Lodge

A full-service resort hotel located in the heart of Grand Teton National Park. The main lodge building is situated on a bluff overlooking Willow Flats and offers attractive accommodations and spectacular views across the water to the skyline of the Grand Teton. The Lounge features a 60-foot window and huge fireplace. There are only 42 guest rooms, many with two twin beds, in the main lodge and 343 motor lodge guest rooms, most with two double beds, along avenues on either side of the main building. Meals are memorable in the Mural Room with its panoramic windows and trapper murals. The adjacent Pioneer Room offers continuous counter service for light meals and snacks. The congenial cocktail lounge is the Stockade Bar whose Old West decor features an 18-foot diorama of trapper life and authentic relics of colorful frontier days. Complete guest facilities include gift shops, apparel shop, breakfast room service, beauty shop, a quiet card room, large heated swimming pool, riding horses, float trips, and a service station. Conference facilities for 500-600 persons available in June and September only; smaller meetings in July and August. Write for a color Conference Brochure before planning your next meeting.

Colter Bay Log Cabins

Set in a wooded area near the shores of Jackson Lake, these 209 snug log cabins sleep up to six persons. Along the lakeshore are a beach and temporary marina. Nearby are the National Park Service amphitheater, Visitor Center, and Indian Arts Museum. Facilities include the Chuckwagon Restaurant, grill, bar, package beer, launderette, gift and apparel store, general store, service stations, post office, float trips, and corral.

Answers and Information that may add to the enjoyment of your Grand Teton National Park experience.

- All of the Grand Teton Lodge Company facilities, except the Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis, are located inside the Park, thereby offering an opportunity to enjoy the ever-changing sights and sounds (or lack thereof) at any time of day or night.
- National Park Ranger Naturalist programs and guided nature hikes are available throughout the park.
- Jackson Lake Lodge is not located on Jackson Lake, but does have a lovely view of the lake across Willow Flats, a marshy area where one can often observe the moose in their native habitat.
- Most of the rooms at Jackson Lake Lodge are located in cluster buildings built along tree-lined avenues on each side of the main building.
- The cabins at Colter Bay Village have a complete bath with shower (no tubs).
- Colter Bay Village, with its roomy cabins, is an excellent family vacation area. The kids will love it.
- Many of the Colter Bay facilities are within an easy walk to the shoreline of Jackson Lake.
- The swimming pool at Jackson Lake Lodge is available to our registered guests from Jenny Lake Lodge and Colter Bay Village Cabins, as well as Jackson Lake Lodge.
- The only regular bus service within the Park is the Shuttle Bus between Jackson Lake Lodge and Colter Bay Village; scheduled hourly, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., seven days a week at a nominal charge.

- You need not be a guest at any of the three facilities to enjoy the excellent but varied food service at each location.
- There are outstanding selections of gift, clothing and accessory items at Jackson Lake Lodge, Colter Bay Village, and the Jackson Hole Golf & Tennis.
- There is a convenience store at the Colter Bay Highway Service Station and a fully stocked grocery store at Colter Bay Village, 1 mile west.
- For the variety of activities available, advance reservations may not always be needed, but are recommended to prevent disappointment.
- Our Snake River Float trip is a scenic trip, not white water, all within Grand Teton National Park.
- We can book white water raft trips for our guests either in advance or upon arrival.
- If you are flying into Jackson Hole Airport, you may want to rent a car to more fully enjoy your visit (advance reservations usually required).
- There is an \$8.50 per person charge, each way, for the Airport Bus service, which connects with all scheduled major airlines.
- Wyoming State Law prohibits anyone under 19 in a bar.
- Our Chefs will prepare the fish you catch.
- Church services are available at Jackson Lake Lodge and Colter Bay Village.
