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Power House (WY-113-F):

The power house is also a one story wood structure without a foundation, whose overall dimensions are 16'-4" by 14'-4". This board and batten structure also has a board and batten door and a single six pane fixed sash window. The roof of the power house is unique. This roof is constructed of wood and is segmentally arched over the narrow ends of the building. In addition, there are exposed rafter eave ends on all sides of the roof. Asphalt roll roofing covers the roof.
