MEMORANDUM for the Secretary.

The Jackson Hole National Monument, established by Proclamation No. 2578 on March 15, 1943, included within its boundaries hay and range lands that for many years have been administered by the Fish and Wildlife Service as an essential part of the National Elk Refuge. A portion of the lands taken from the Elk Refuge for monument purposes consists of lands acquired and leased pursuant to specific authority from Congress. The Monument area also included some public lands that previously had been reserved and set aside as a part of the Refuge.

In order to clarify the respective administrative responsibilities of the Fish and Wildlife Service and of the National Park Service over these lands, it is recommended that:

1. The Fish and Wildlife Service will administer all lands included within the boundary described in Presidential Proclamation No. 2578, dated March 15, 1943, lying east of the Jackson-Moran Highway and south of the Gros Ventre River, for refuge purposes.
2. The National Park Service will administer all lands included within the boundary described in Executive Orders No. 7489, dated November 14, 1936, and No. 7680, dated July 30, 1937, lying west of the Jackson-Moran Highway and north of the Gros Ventre River, for monument purposes.

Your approval of this inter-bureau policy is respectfully requested.

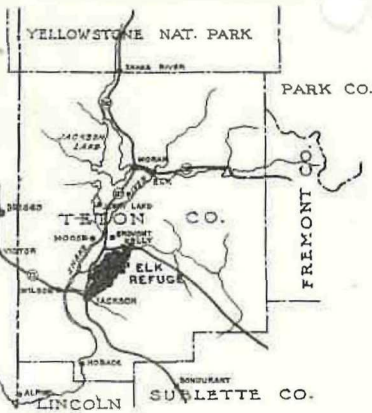

SIXTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN

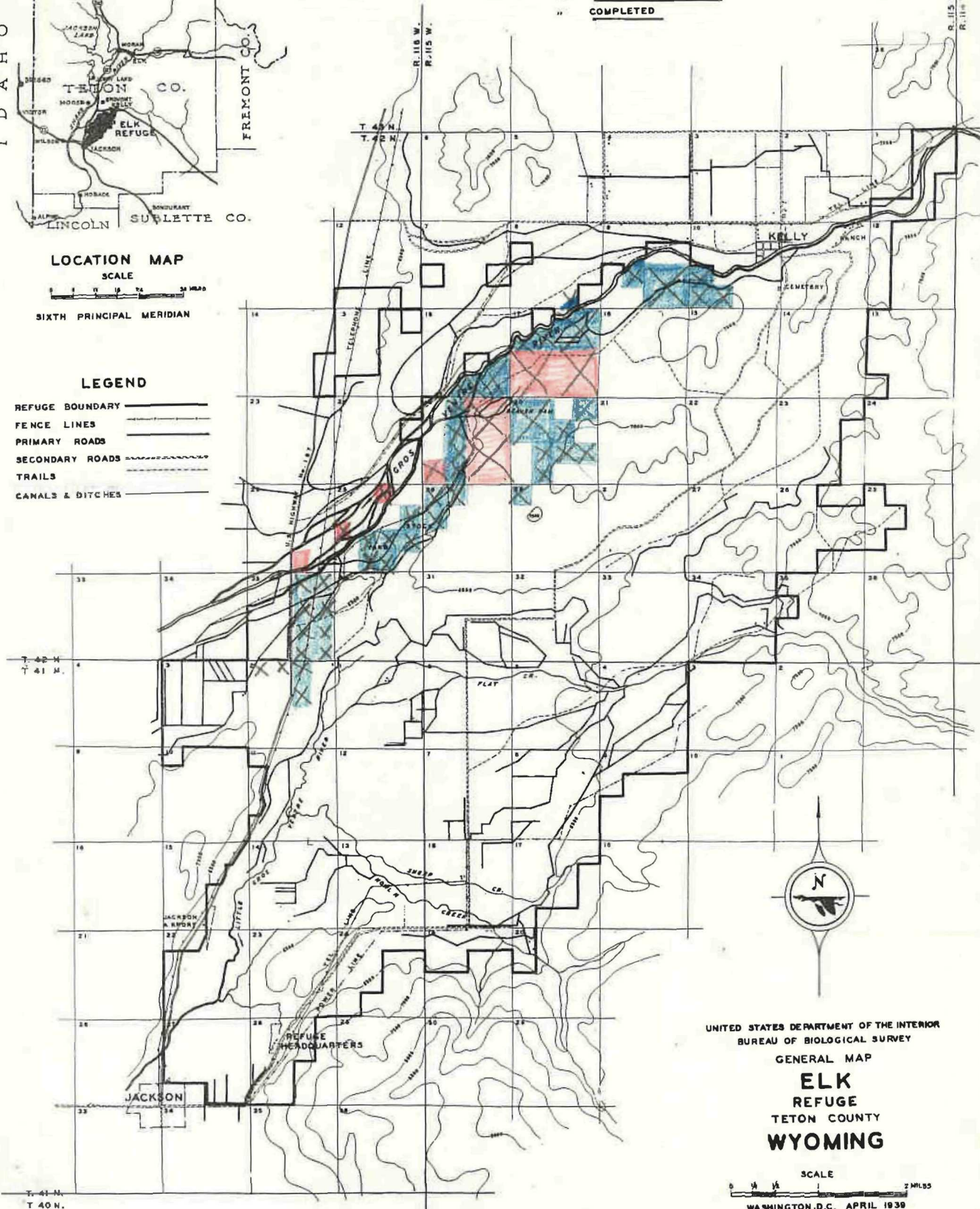
