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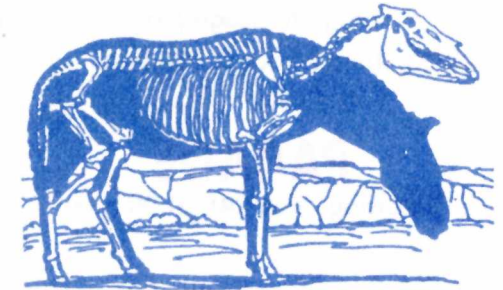

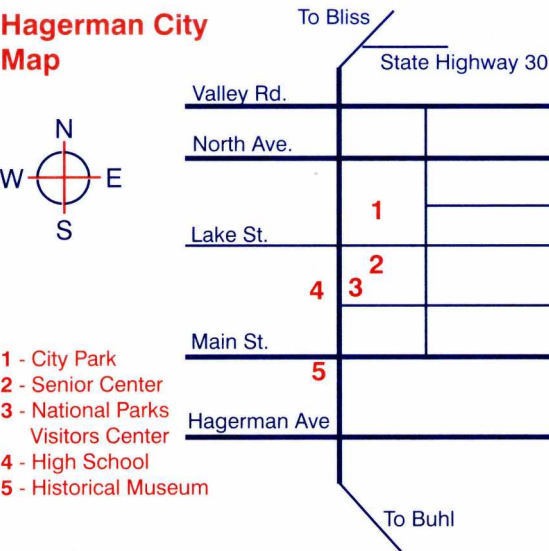

National Park Service Information

Often, when you talk about fossils, people want to know
what happened to the Dinosaurs? Perhaps a more
interesting question is what happened to the Horses?

Did you know that the Horse evolved in North America?
The Hagerman Horse, the Idaho State Fossil, Equus
simplicidens, was the first true horse, about the size of a
modern Arabian horse, However its bones most closely
resemble a zebra. During the Ice Ages, when ocean
levels were lower than today, humans and animals were
moving between the new world and the old world.
Horses migrated into Asia/Europe and Africa only to
later become extinct in North America about 10,000
years ago. Spanish Explorers later introduced what is
considered the modern horse back into North America
several hundred years ago.

Hagerman is home to over a hundred different species
of fossil animals. The list includes Saber-tooth cats, a
large Hyena-like Dog, Peccary, Mastodon, Otter, Bear,
Shrews, Camels, Ground Sloth, Cormorant, Swans,
Muskrat and Rabbits as well as many others. With over
3,000 new fossils found each year, it is the most
fossiliferous Pliocene-aged site in the world!

Hagerman Valley Museum

The Hagerman Valley Historical Society Museum is
located on the corner of State Street (Highway 30) and
Main Street in Hagerman. On display are nationally
known art works, historical artifacts and early
photographs of the area. Also, memorabilia and oral
histories from area families are available for study.
