



Welcome to the Theodore Roosevelt Birthplace National Historic Site

This home, reconstructed in 1923, was acquired by the National Park Service in 1962 as a means of presenting the life and legacy of the United States' 26th President – Theodore Roosevelt – to the American people.

The mission of the National Park Service is to preserve and protect America's public lands, cultural resources, and historic sites. It is the duty of the **Park Ranger** to care for these sites and, as a **Junior Ranger**, you will have the opportunity to aid in this mission!

To become a Junior Ranger, explore the museum, complete this booklet, and bring it to a Park Ranger to receive your official badge!







Meet the Roosevelts

Theodore Roosevelt's life was greatly influenced by the people who loved him. Despite his many illnesses, "Teedie" learned to build both his mind and his body with the help of his mother and father, among others. After touring the gallery, **draw a line** that matches the Roosevelt family members to their names and descriptions. Also, think about how the people in your life help make you who you are!

















<u>Martha "Mittie" Roosevelt</u>: Wife of Theodore Roosevelt Sr. and mother of the future President. She was born in Georgia but quickly became a member of New York high society.

Robert B. Roosevelt: Uncle of Teddy Roosevelt and resident of 26 E. 20th Street. He was New York State Fish Commissioner and a member of the House of Representatives. He kept many pets in his home, including a monkey!

<u>Anna "Bamie" Roosevelt</u>: Teddy Roosevelt's strong-willed older sister who was born with a twisted spine. As a child, she helped raise her siblings when her mother wasn't able and, as an adult, she led the restoration of this museum.

<u>Cornelius Van Shack Roosevelt</u>: The grandfather of Teddy Roosevelt, and one of the only millionaires in the nation during the 19th century. He made his fortune importing plate glass and was able to give each of his five sons a brownstone house as a wedding present.

<u>Edith Kermit Carrow</u>: The childhood best friend of Teddy Roosevelt and future First Lady of the United States. She and Teddy married in 1886.

<u>Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt</u>: A small sickly boy born at 28 E. 20th Street who, in his adulthood, would come to be known as a Rough Rider, statesman, "bull moose," and 26th President of the United States.

<u>Margaret Barnhill Roosevelt</u>: Teddy's grandmother. A Pennsylvania woman who married Cornelius Roosevelt and introduced Quaker principles to the family. Her belief in sharing wealth with others would greatly influence her son and grandson's lives' work.

<u>Theodore "Thee" Roosevelt Sr.</u>: Nicknamed "Greatheart" by his children, he was the generous father of the future president and the co-founder of the American Museum of Natural History and Metropolitan Museum of Art, among other institutions.




← This is the nursery where Teddy and his siblings grew up in the 1800s. How does this bedroom compare to bedrooms today?
