How to get to Isle Royale National Park

There is the lure of new travel horizons at enchanting Isle Royale. Here, in the atmosphere of the north woods are unspoiled stretches of forest — magnificent shorelines and seascapes. Here is the quiet beauty of nature — and serenity.

Isle Royale National Park, in northwestern Lake Superior, is from 50 to 70 miles from Upper Michigan's Copper Country and 18 miles from the nearest point on the Minnesota Shore. The island, about 45 miles long and 9 miles wide, comprises a land area of 210 square miles.

Part of the fun of your Isle Royale vacation is the thrilling trip across the brilliant blue waters of Lake Superior to Rock Harbor Lodge or Windigo. Passenger boats, originating at Grand Portage, on Minnesota's scenic north shore, and Houghton and Copper Harbor, in the Copper Country of Michigan's Upper Peninsula, provide transportation to Isle Royale National Park. Parking areas are provided at these points on the mainland, since there are no roads or cars on the island. Parking fees may be charged.

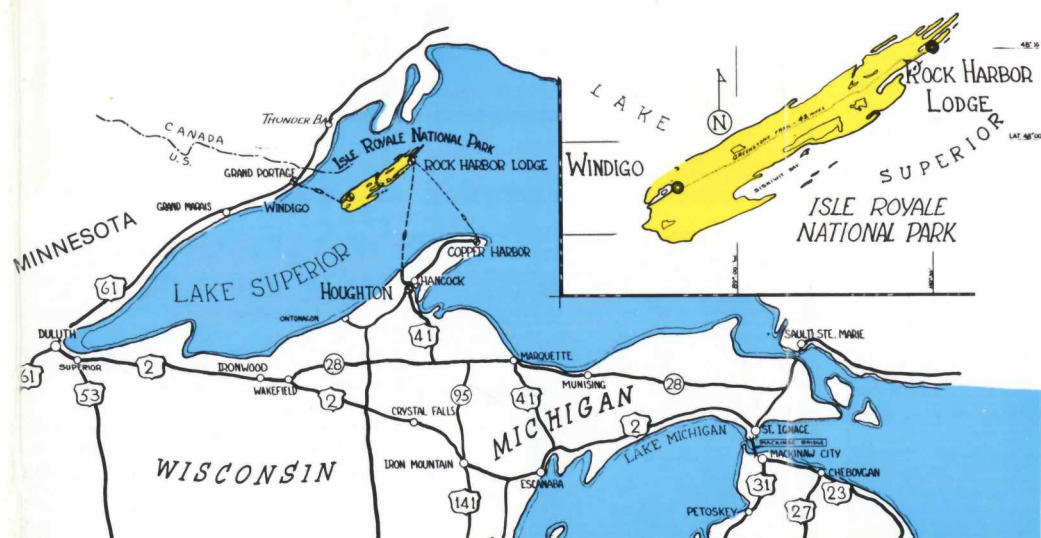
The finest way to enjoy an Isle Royale vacation is to spend some time at Rock Harbor Lodge. Rock Harbor Lodge has excellent American Plan accommodations and housekeeping rooms.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING

Nights are cool and the daytime temperatures range between 65 and 75 degrees, so warm clothing is appropriate. Lodge accommodations are informal, so you feel at home in casual clothes. Sturdy hiking shoes will add to your comfort and occasionally you will need rain gear. There are many opportunities to use binoculars, water filters, water bottles, day packs and cameras. The marina store offers a selection of films, sunglasses, groceries, campers supplies and similar items.

Plan now for your Isle Royale National Park adventure. Hike the trails for an exciting glimpse of moose — thrill to the tug of the fighting trout — seek the solitude of the lush green forests and the inspiring beauty of the tranquil harbors. An Isle Royale vacation is an experience you will want to repeat year after year. There is no public telephone service available.
