Reference is had to the report of Special Agent Guthrey (I.D. 1291-B; D.I. 35758), dated June 23, 1941, concerning an examination of the Twin Reservoir No. 1, affecting certain lands in sec. 4, T. 2 S., R. 8 E., S. B. M., California, within the Joshua Tree National Monument.

The records of this office do not show that any rights-of-way for reservoir sites have been granted by this Department in said sec. 4. The special agent reports that no improvements whatever were found on the land.

This office is, therefore, of the opinion that no valid claim can be made to the reservoir site in question.
