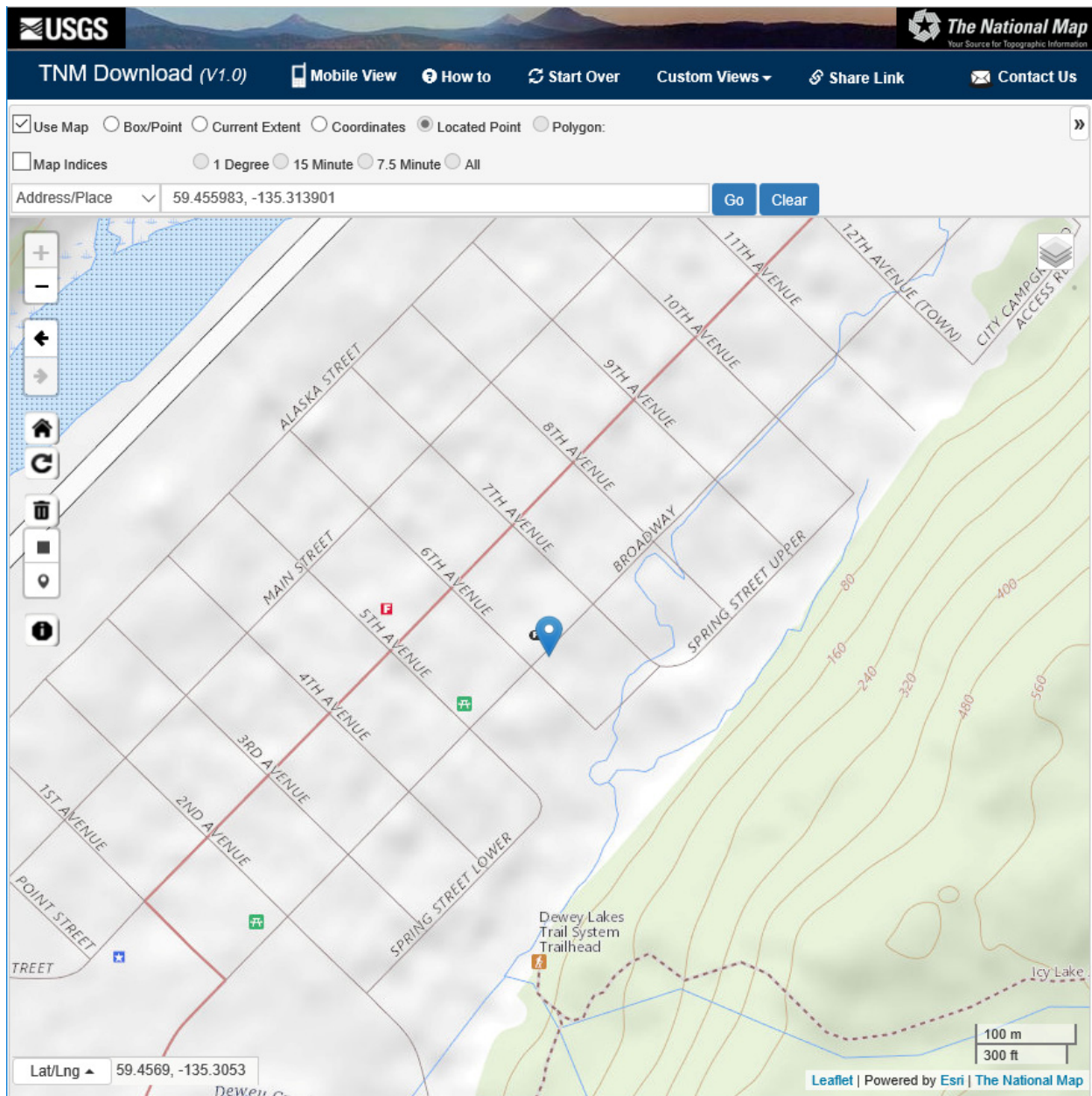

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| AK-285-1 | West (front) facade of Nome Saloon. The saloon was built at this location in 1899. A cornice at the eave level is mirrored by a cornice at the second floor. There are three pairs of one-over-one sash windows on the second floor. On the first floor, a diagonal recessed entry is bordered by plate glass storefront and transom windows. At the northwest corner of the building, a pilaster and a secondary entrance leading to the second floor are present. |
| AK-285-2 | South (side) facade of Nome Saloon. The cornice at eave level from the front wall continues around the corner of the building. Four pairs of one-over-one sash windows are present on the second floor. A cornice return ends above storefront windows at the southwest corner. |
