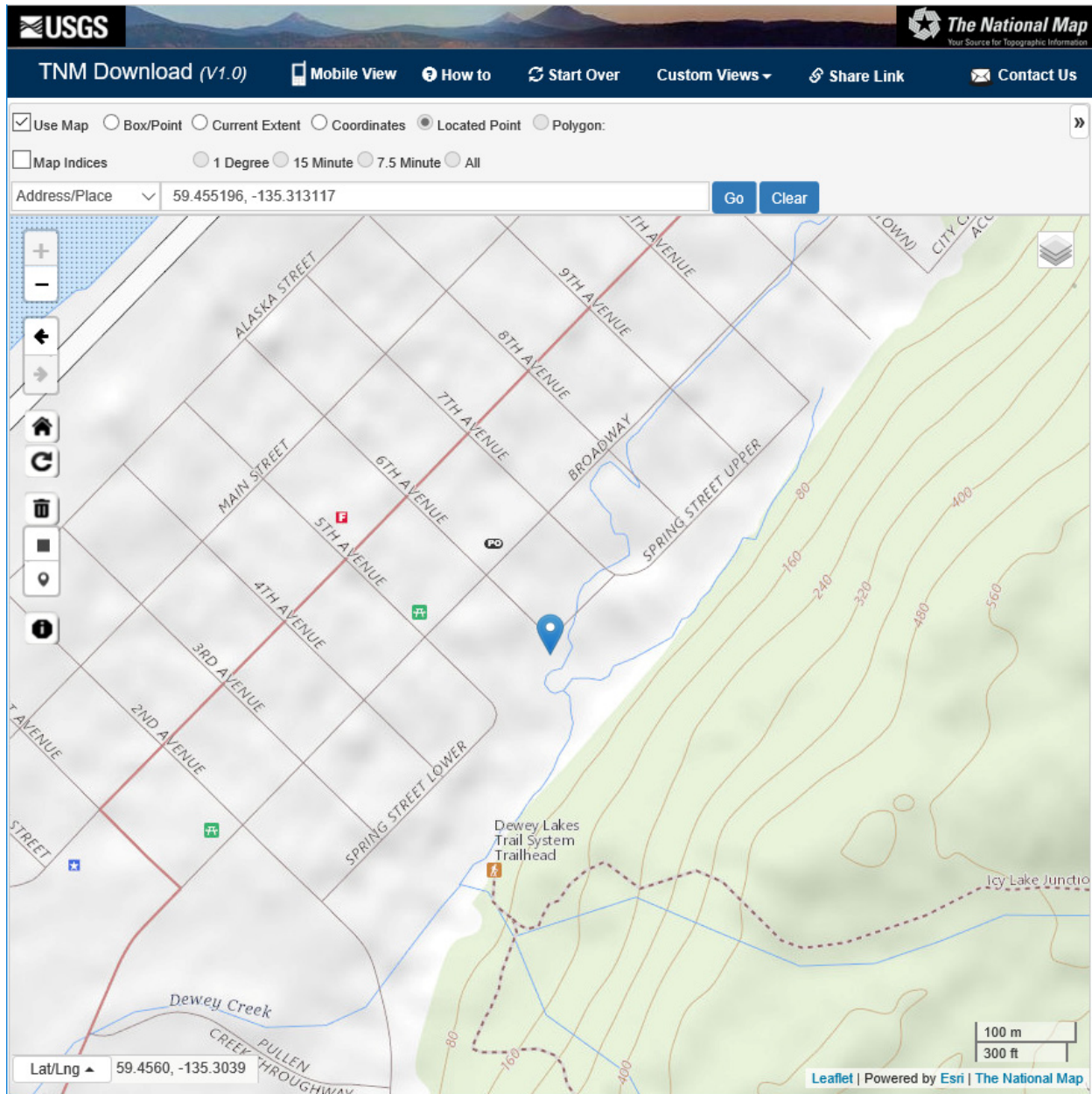

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North facade of Wynn-Johnson House. The two-story wood frame structure has a gable roof and beveled tongue-and-groove siding, four boarded window openings on the first and second floor levels, and a non-historic door. Markings on the second floor level are evidence of a porch that was previously attached to the building. The Wynn-Johnson House was built in 1905 on 3rd Avenue and Spring Street. The building was moved twice. Between 1915 and 1916 Harriet Pullen purchased and moved the building to her property at the east end of 6th Avenue. The building was moved again in 1939 to its current location.

The Wynn-Johnson House is located at longitude: 59.455196, latitude: -135.313117. This point represents the front door. It was obtained by Jen Larsen, Biological Wildlife Technician & GIS Specialist, Klondike Gold Rush National Historical Park, in August 2019 working with historical building spatial layers within ArcMap (NAD83).
