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Within Skagway, cardinal directions are colloquially oriented with reference to the city's street grid instead of true north. The north-south axis is aligned with Broadway, making "north" closer to northeast. The photo captions follow this convention.

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| AK-295-1 | Contextual view of the property from southwest. The 1886 Captain Moore Cabin is in northwest corner of the lot (photo left). The Moore House can be seen through the Sitka Spruce trees that line the boardwalk. The trees were planted by the Moore Family. The Moore Cabin and Moore House are contributing resources #368 and 369 (respectively) to the Skagway & White Pass District National Historic Landmark. The Moore Homestead is managed by the National Park Service as a cultural landscape. View to northeast. |
| AK-295-2 | Contextual view of the property from Fifth Avenue. A survey pin marks the boundary of the property. The National Park Service moved the perimeter fence and boardwalk in 2000 at the request of the Municipality of Skagway. View to northeast. |
| AK-295-3 | Contextual view from the southeast corner of the lot. The Moore House, Chicken Coop, Privy, and Auto Shed are visible. AB Mountain is seen in the background with clouds covering the peak. The Frye-Bruhn Cold Storage Building (HABS AK-224) is seen through the Sitka Spruce trees. View to northwest. |
| AK-295-4 | Contextual view from the northeastern corner of the lot, inside the kitchen garden fence. The Auto Shed (left foreground), Moore House, Chicken Coop, and Privy are visible. View to west. |

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AK-295-5 The Privy (foreground) is modern reconstruction based on historic images of the property. The historic Auto Shed stands in the corner of the fenced area in the background right. View to east.

AK-295-6 Contextual view of the fence, Moore Cabin, and Moore House. View to east.
