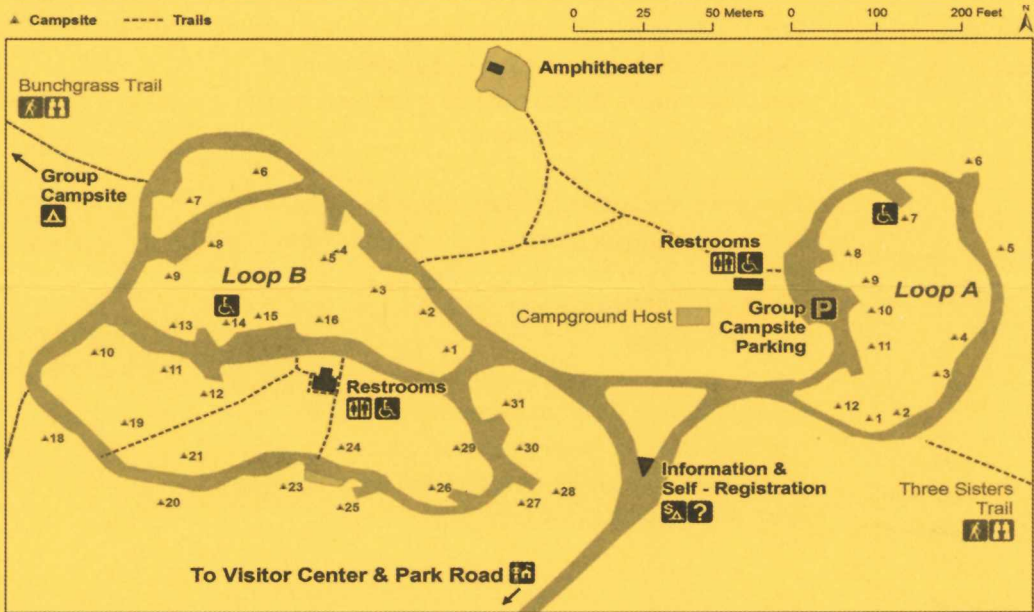




Campground Information



Facilities

The historic Indian Well campground was constructed in the 1930’s by the Civilian Conservation Corps. It is located 1/2 mi (0.8 km) from the visitor center and Cave Loop. The campground has 41 sites available on a first-come, first-served basis. There are sites suitable for tents, pickup campers, small trailers, and there are a limited number of sites that accomodate motor homes from 25-30 feet. Each site has a picnic table and a fire ring. Restrooms with water and flush toilets are available year-round.

There are no showers, hookups, dump stations, or other amenities such as gas or propane available. Firewood is available seasonally at the campgrounds.

Fees and Ranger Programs

The camping fee is \$10.00 per night for each site occupied; unoccupied sites may not be held for others. Holders of an Access or Senior pass receive a 50 percent discount on their individual site.

Monument entrance fees are also due separately at the Visitor Center or the entrance station near Gillems Camp.

Ranger-guided activities are posted weekly at bulletin boards during the summer season.

Campground Rules

Please be considerate of other campers, especially if you are camping with a large group. Children must be supervised at all times.

Limits

Campsite capacity is limited to 8 people and two vehicles or three motorcycles per site (where space is available). Vehicles must be parked on pavement. The maximum stay in the campground is 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period.

Fires

Fires are permitted in designated fire rings and grates only. To preserve the integrity of the landscape, wood collecting is prohibited in the monument. Firewood is available for purchase seasonally in the campground and in neighboring towns; dead and down wood may also be collected outside of Lava Beds on the Modoc National Forest. Campfires must not be left unattended. Fires may be prohibited during periods of high fire danger.

Pets

Pets are permitted in the campground, but must be kept on a leash no longer than 6 ft (1.8 m). Pets are not permitted in caves, on trails, or in buildings.

Check-out time is 12:00 pm.

Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am.

Generator hours are from 8:00 am to 10:00 am and 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm

Hunting Camps

Hunting and hunted game are not allowed in the park. The discharging of firearms is prohibited within the monument.



Backcountry Camping	Free backcountry camping is also permitted at Lava Beds, and provides an experience of wilderness solitude. Restrictions are in place for camping near developed areas and caves.	Fires are prohibited, and no surface water is available.
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Group Campsite Information	Fees are \$3.00 per person (including children) per night with a minimum of \$45 and a maximum of \$60.00 per night. A minimum of 15 campers and a maximum of 40 are permitted. The group site is gated. Vehicles may be parked beyond the gate for loading and unloading only. All vehicles must be parked in the “A” Loop overflow parking area near the restrooms (see map on reverse). Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am. Children must be supervised at all times. Pets are permitted in the group campsite, but must be on a leash no longer than six feet (18m).	This is a primitive site and has: • 2 pit toilets • 1 Water spigot • 1 large fire pit with benches • 2 large charcoal grills All regulations for the regular campgrounds apply to the group campsite.
