During the American Civil War, Kentucky sat on the seam of a nation tearing itself apart. On a cold January morning in 1862, Federal and Confederate forces clashed on muddy Kentucky fields as they sought control of this key border state. As the first major Federal victory in the western theater, the Battle of Mill Springs boosted morale, secured Kentucky's place in the Union, and contributed to future US victories during the Civil War.
