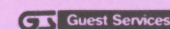

PARADISE INN

Elevation 5,400 ft. / May 22–October 4, 1987

Located in a pristine alpine setting, Paradise Inn was opened in 1917 and remains a historic landmark. A massive lobby with huge open beams in a cathedral ceiling welcomes guests and visitors alike. Two massive stone fireplaces which flank the lobby provide a natural gathering place for resting or visiting. The spacious dining room seats 200 and the Glacier Lounge serves beverages. Visit the Gift Shop to see beautifully handcarved soapstone and other native American handcrafted items.

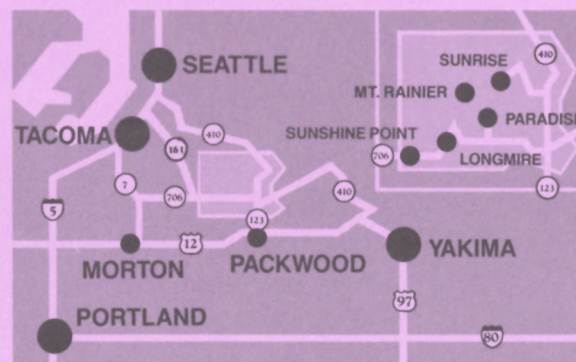
