



Focus on Stehekin

2003 - 2004



North Cascades National Park Service Complex, located in north-central Washington State, is characterized by a mix of jagged mountain peaks, glaciers, lush and diverse forests, and tumbling waterfalls. The park complex includes North Cascades National Park and Ross Lake and Lake Chelan National Recreation Areas. Lake Chelan National Recreation Area encompasses the upper 4.5 miles of Lake Chelan and remote Stehekin, nestled in the glacier-carved Stehekin Valley. The small community of Stehekin has no road connections to the rest of the world. Visitors and residents arrive by passenger ferry, private boat, floatplane, horseback, and on foot. Trails into large areas of wilderness branch off the Stehekin Valley Road ascending to the rugged mountains. The road begins at the boat landing and follows the meandering Stehekin River to Cottonwood Camp, 23 miles upvalley.

Stehekin is a treasure of significant natural and cultural features including the historic Golden West Lodge. Built in 1926 utilizing portions of the old Field Hotel, the lodge provided overnight accommodations until 1972. During the summer of 2003, renovation of the Golden West Lodge will be completed and it will function as the National Park Service district office while continuing to serve as a the park visitor center. Until that time, you can find information and assistance at the **Purple Point Information Center**; the large, pale green building located 400 yards up-valley from the boat landing. Watch for directional signs to the current visitor center location. We appreciate your patience and hope you can celebrate the re-opening of the **Golden West Visitor Center** with us this summer.

Park Service Information

Park Service information is available daily, May through mid-October (8:30 am – 5:00 pm with reduced hours in spring and fall). During the summer, the **Golden West Visitor Center** will re-open. Upon your arrival look for directional signs to the current visitor center location, where you can find the following:

- **Rangers** available to assist you with trail information, backcountry permits and general information about the area.
- **Naturalist Programs** including evening programs and short-talks presented daily. Check area bulletin boards for more information about ranger-led walks, tours and children's activities.
- **Exhibits and Relief Map**
- **The Golden West Gallery** displaying artwork related to Stehekin and the North Cascades by area artists. Programs and workshops presented by the artists throughout the summer.
- **"A Wilderness Place"**, a ten-minute slide program includes narration and images of Stehekin and the surrounding wilderness area.

Getting to Stehekin

Lake Chelan Boat Company: Passenger boats provide round-trip transportation service between Chelan and Stehekin with scheduled stops at Field's Point and Lucerne. Daily service is available from March 15th through October 31st with reduced service during the winter months. Prices vary by vessel and season. Write Lake Chelan Boat Company at P.O. Stehekin Transportation

The 23-mile Stehekin Valley Road is paved for four miles from Stehekin Landing and becomes gravel at Harlequin Campground. Views of the Stehekin River, glacier-clad jagged peaks, and dense coniferous forests are found along the way. Transportation is offered along the road for your enjoyment and convenience. Drivers provide a narrated tour, as well as camping and hiking information. You may get on or off the buses at any location. Infant and child safety seats are available on the NPS bus.

Stehekin Valley Road Status: Beyond High Bridge, 11 miles from the landing, many sections of the road were damaged by the floods of November '95. At present, the road is open to Glory Mountain, 20.1 miles from Stehekin Landing. Above Glory Mountain, a channel of the river flows down the road for approximately 3000 ft. Due to this damage, the road will remain closed for 2.7 miles between Glory Mountain and Cottonwood Camp until conditions change and the road can be repaired. A trail is maintained along the damaged section of road. Hikers, bicycles and horseback parties are able to use this trail. Ask a ranger about latest conditions on the road.

National Park Service Shuttle Van:

Reservations are strongly recommended to guarantee a seat and can be made in person, at ranger stations in Stehekin, Chelan, Marblemount, North Cascades Visitor Center in Newhalem and Sedro-Woolley Information Station. Reservations may be made in advance by calling the national park visitor center in Stehekin at (360) 856-5700, ext. 340, then ext. 14 after May 14. Long-term reservations must be reconfirmed by telephone or in person between 2 and 4 days in advance of the bus ride or departure on trail. Otherwise, the reservations will be cancelled. Buses do not leave specified points before the scheduled times. *Vehicle, road, or other problems sometimes cause delays and adjustments to schedules. Call ahead for current road conditions.*

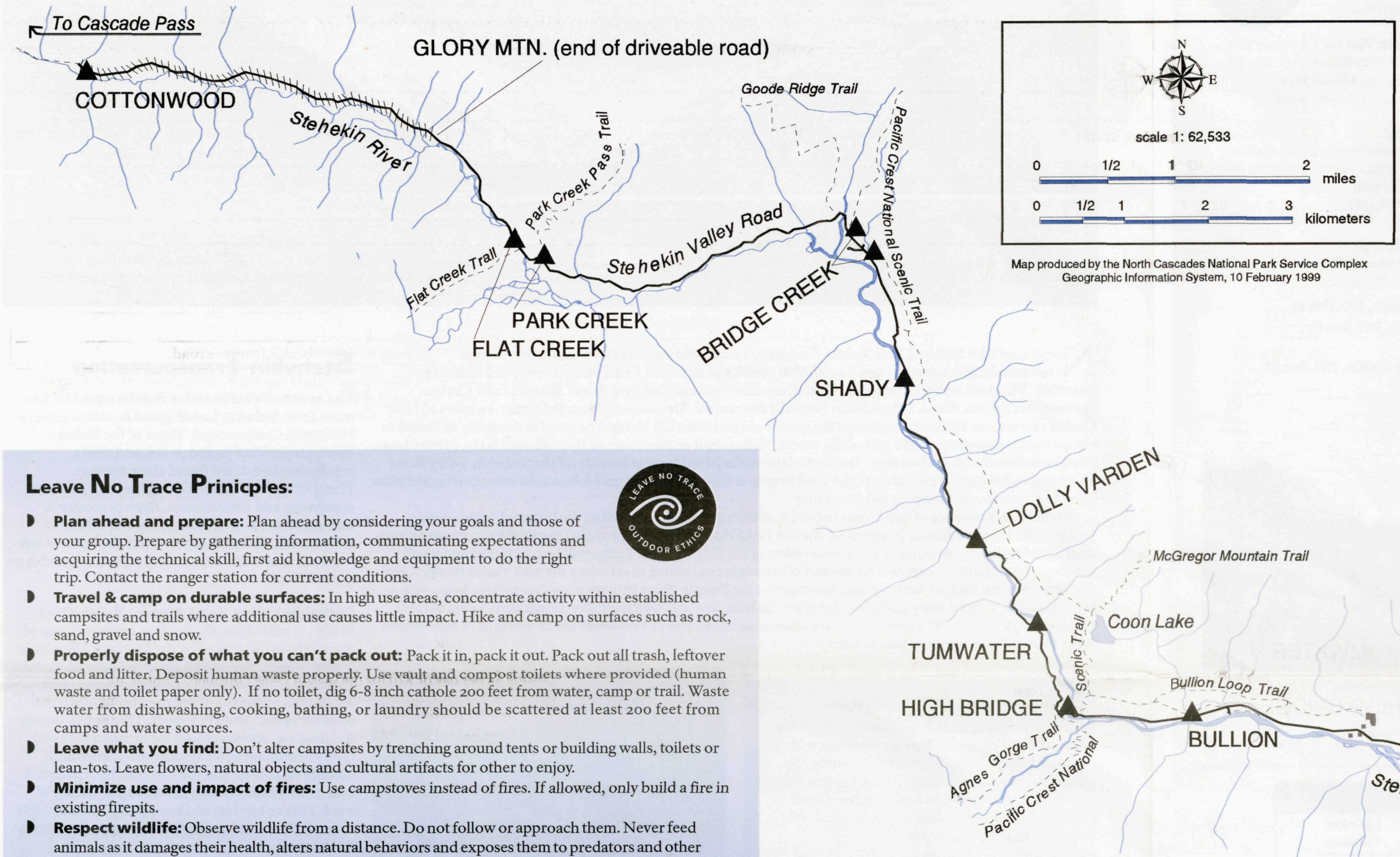
The Stehekin Shuttle (lower valley): This bus runs from Stehekin Landing to High Bridge. The bus accommodates backpacks and bicycles. No reservations are required for this 36-passenger bus. A *Bakery Special* ride between Stehekin Landing and the Stehekin Pastry Company is available for \$1 one way.

Stehekin Valley Road Area Map



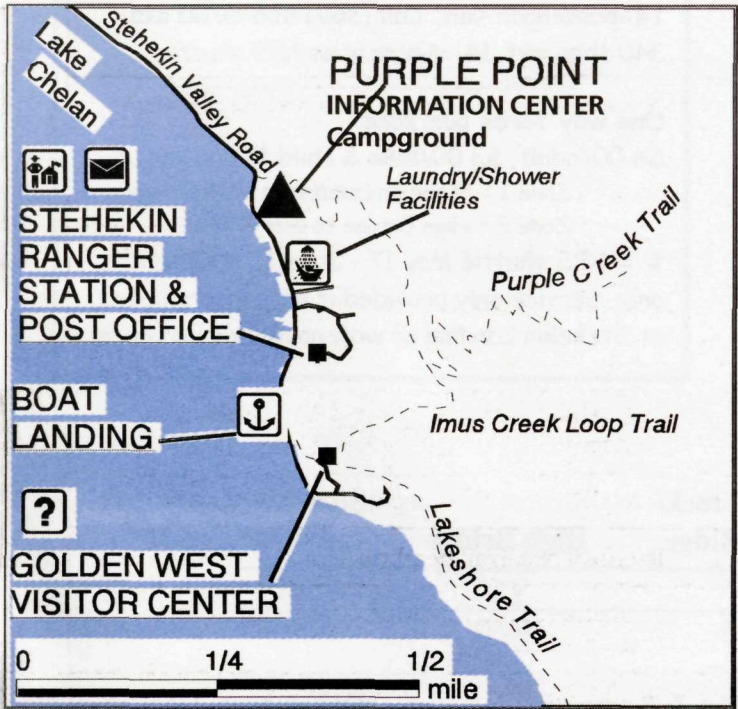
Leave No Trace Principles:

- Plan ahead and prepare: Plan ahead by considering your goals and those of your group. Prepare by gathering information, communicating expectations and acquiring the technical skill, first aid knowledge and equipment to do the right trip. Contact the ranger station for current conditions.
- Travel & camp on durable surfaces: In high use areas, concentrate activity within established campsites and trails where additional use causes little impact. Hike and camp on surfaces such as rock, sand, gravel and snow.
- Properly dispose of what you can't pack out: Pack it in, pack it out. Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter. Deposit human waste properly. Use vault and compost toilets where provided (human waste and toilet paper only). If no toilet, dig 6-8 inch cathole 200 feet from water, camp or trail. Waste water from dishwashing, cooking, bathing, or laundry should be scattered at least 200 feet from camps and water sources.
- Leave what you find: Don't alter campsites by trenching around tents or building walls, toilets or lean-tos. Leave flowers, natural objects and cultural artifacts for other to enjoy.
- Minimize use and impact of fires: Use campstoves instead of fires. If allowed, only build a fire in existing firepits.
- Respect wildlife: Observe wildlife from a distance. Do not follow or approach them. Never feed animals as it damages their health, alters natural behaviors and exposes them to predators and other dangers.
- Be considerate of other visitors: Let nature's sounds prevail by avoiding loud voices and noises. Be courteous. Yield to other users on the trail.

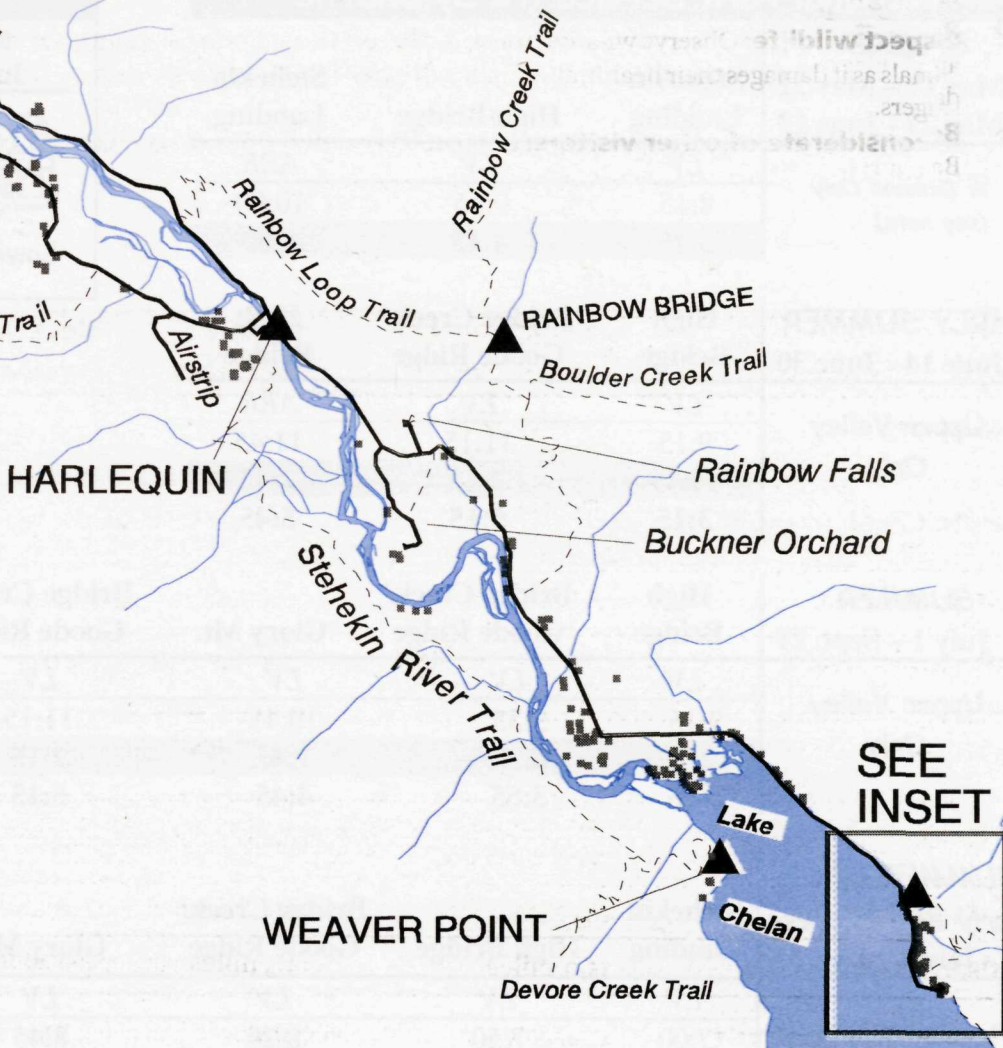

Free backcountry permits are needed for overnight stays at all North Cascades National Park Service Complex camps year-round. Permits available at Ranger Stations on a first-come, first-served basis up to a day in advance.

No NPS backcountry permit needed for Lake Chelan boat-in sites. Use of all federal docks on Lake Chelan requires a U.S. Forest Service dock permit, costing \$5 per day or \$40 for the season (May 1 through October 31).

Stehekin Pastry Company: Located 1.9 miles from the Landing. The bakery offers fresh baked goods, coffee, refreshments and ice cream. Open daily June to September.

Winter Activities: Recreational activities are available throughout the year. Cross-country skiing and snowshoeing are popular winter pursuits. 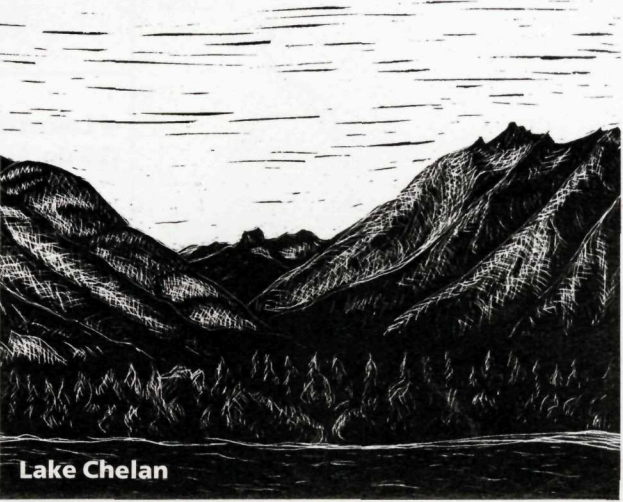
