PREFACE

This bibliography represents the selected literature on the history of conservation in the United States. More specifically, it concentrates upon the organizations, institutions, events and individuals prominently associated with the issues of conservation in the United States.

The literature cited covers materials published from 1900 to the present. Although no effort was made to cover the literature prior to 1900 or subsequent to 1968, about ten items prior to 1900 have been listed along with four titles subsequent to 1968. Owing to the surfeit of periodical literature on this subject, this compilation contains only a scant number of periodical articles. The determining criteria for inclusion of these articles are eminence of author, relevancy of subject matter, and frequency of citation in other works.

The arrangement of the bibliography is chronological by date of publication, starting with the earliest publication date. Following the list of references are alphabetically arranged subject and author indexes. The appendices include a list of periodicals frequently containing articles on conservation of natural resources, and a list of abstracting and indexing services covering the literature of natural resources. Both lists are arranged alphabetically by title.

Special acknowledgement goes to Mr. Jesse Grove, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, who examined the initial listing and made suggestions which were incorporated into the final bibliography. Any errors or omissions are, of course, the responsibility of the compiler.
