HISTORIC LAKE CRESCENT LODGE is located on the shore of Lake Crescent in Olympic National Park, Washington. You will arrive via U.S. 101 from either Port Angeles to the east or Aberdeen to the southwest.

Excellent food is served in the Lodge Dining Room. Specialties include Salmon, Steaks, Scallops, Quilcene Oysters and Dungeness Crab. (Fresh breads, pies, chowder and soups are made daily in our kitchen). Complete Dinners range from \$10.95 to \$15.95.

HIKING SUPPLIES — Check with our shop for film, sunglasses, and other items you may need.

PETS — Park Regulations require pets to be kept on leash at all times and are not permitted in public buildings, on park trails or in the back country.

GIFT AND CRAFT SHOP — Authentic Indian Handicraft, including collectors items, gifts, books, post cards, photo supplies and a variety of gift items make shopping a real pleasure.

ROWBOATS may be rented at Lake Crescent Lodge for a day on the lake. Enjoy views of Storm King Mountain while you fish. Rates \$5.00 hr.; ½ day \$12.00; \$20.00 for a full day.

THE RAIN FOREST valleys on the west side of the peninsula are unique features of Olympic National Park. Giant stands of Douglas-fir, Sitka-spruce, red cedar, and hemlock tower above mosses that carpet the forest floor and drape the branches in lacy festoons.

RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES

BOATING — Lake Crescent, one of the most beautiful lakes in the country, is splendid for boating. There are Lodge rowboats for your convenience or your own boat may be launched at the nearby public boat ramp.

FISHING — The thrill and excitement of trout fishing is at its best in the rushing, glacier-fed streams and lakes. Salmon fishing is also popular in the Straits of Juan de Fuca and along the Pacific Coast. No fishing license is required in the park, but a state punch card for salmon and steelhead is required.

HIKING — Some 600 miles of trails lead through the dense forests and into the snow-clad mountains of Olympic National Park. There are unlimited photographic opportunities. The Marymere Falls Nature Trail leads from the Lodge to the nearby falls.

BEACHCOMBING is part of the fun of your Olympic vacation.

CLIMATE — Summers on the Olympic Peninsula are mild. Occasional rains do occur.

VISITING CANADA — Ferry Service and Airline Service are available from Port Angeles to Victoria, British Columbia. During peak season, contact ferry office for waiting time for departure

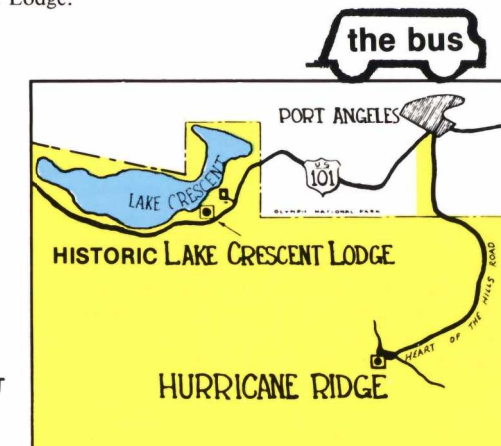

OLYMPIC NATIONAL PARK

HISTORIC LAKE CRESCENT LODGE is located on U.S. Highway 101 in Olympic National Park, twenty miles west of Port Angeles, Washington. Daily air and bus service is provided between Seattle and Port Angeles. Cab service from Port Angeles to Lake Crescent Lodge and Hurricane Ridge. Clallam County Transit provides bus service from Port Angeles to Lake Crescent Lodge.

The elegance of yesteryear invites you to relax by the huge stone fireplace in the antique furnished lobby, originally known as "Singer's Tavern." Relax at the end of the day with your favorite beverage in the lounge; and enjoy the splendor of a Lake Crescent sunset. The lakeside dining room offers a selection of Northwestern seafood and fine wines, matched only by the friendly service and hospitality.

HURRICANE RIDGE, only 17 miles from Port Angeles, is the only area of Olympic National Park where you can drive from sea level, through lowland, montane, and sub-alpine forests to reach the wildflower carpeted meadows and scenic vistas of the park's high country. Hurricane Ridge is also the easiest place in the park to see deer, and to be seen by the dozens of marmots which colonize the slopes near Hurricane Ridge Visitor Center. The view of the glaciated Olympic Mountains from the visitor center makes it a perfect place to enjoy lunch in the Snack Bar. Adjoining the Snack Bar is a gift and craft shop which features some of the best examples of authentic northwest Native American handicraft to be found on the Olympic Peninsula.

HURRICANE RIDGE WINTER RECREATION AREA is open week-ends and holiday periods from mid-December to late March. In addition to the Snack Bar, ski and snowshoe rentals are available. Nearby ski lifts, cross country trails and tubing runs make Hurricane Ridge a special recreation spot as well as a place to enjoy the striking winter time scenery.

OLYMPIC NATIONAL PARK is a magnificent unspoiled wilderness of glacier-clad peaks, alpine meadows, cascading streams, unspoiled coastline and virgin forests. Days of exploring can be spent on thrilling alpine drives, beachcombing on the Pacific, or strolling through the intriguing rain forest with its lacy ferns, giant conifers and festoons of mosses.

Whether you are after the excitement and challenge of catching the illusive Beards-lee trout from the turquoise blue waters of Lake Crescent or just experiencing an Olympic sunset, you will find the adventure you have been waiting for in Olympic National Park.
