13. DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, EXISTANT EQUIPMENT, AND IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.

Built by Avery and Julia Singer around 1916, ^{the} Cabin and the Workshop building was among the first constructed buildings at Singer's Lake Crescent Tavern. In scale, design, and materials it closely resembles the existing row of guest cabins to the north, constructed around 1915. A portion of this building may, at one time, have served as guest sleeping quarters. This building was probably created from two separate unattached buildings. Since 1951, no significant alterations have been made to the building exterior. Little is known of the social history of the building.

L-plan in shape; originally two separate bldgs.; one rectangle connected to smaller square structure; measures 14' x 30' and 12' x 17'; 1 story; wood-frame wall construction; shingle siding; post and pier foundation combined with concrete foundation beneath one section of structure; small fixed-light windows on front elevation; small-light windows in upper portion of door. Porch with shed roof; exposed rafters project to edge of roof; porch roof supported by square posts; pipes associated with laundry functions located on north elevation. Alterations: possible relocation of one section of building. Siting: on edge of wooded area; part of the Singer's Tavern building group.

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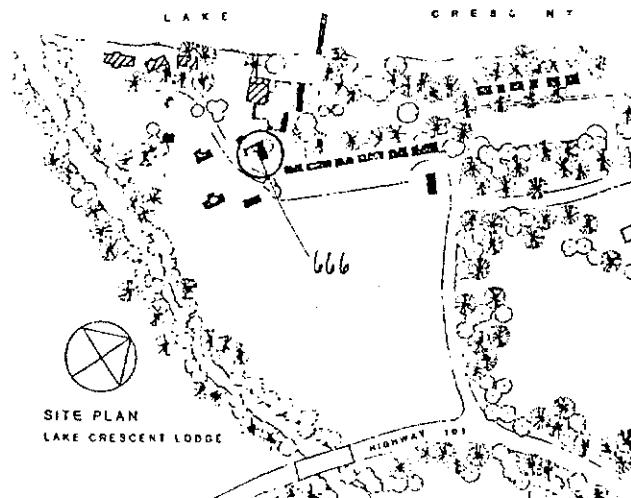
