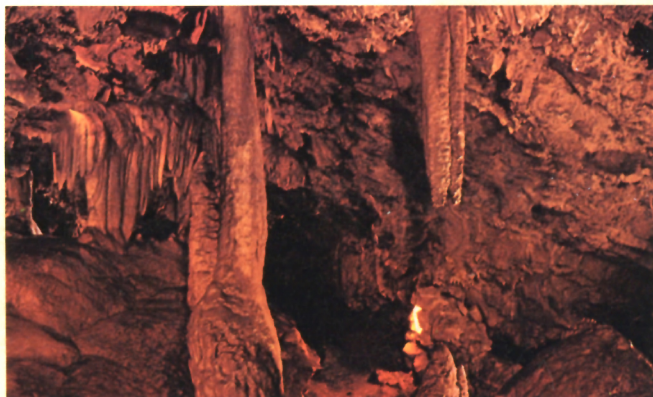

A visit to Oregon is not complete without experiencing the beauty of Crater Lake National Park. At Rim Village, the Lodge blends harmoniously with its natural surroundings; within is a spacious lobby and the main dining room featuring quality cuisine and Oregon wines. At the Cafeteria-Gift Shop Building, excellent food is available in the pleasant surroundings of the cafeteria. The Watchman Deli-Lounge, located upstairs, has an outstanding view of Crater Lake and offers food and cocktails. The Fountain offers ice cream and a full line of take-out foods. The Camper's Store carries a selection of groceries and camper items. The Gift Shop offers a wide selection of souvenirs, Pacific Northwest handicrafts, books, and clothing. Mazama Campground (198 sites) is located at South Entrance. Gas Station is near Park Headquarters. The two hour launch trip around the lake's 25 mile shoreline enhances your appreciation of this beautiful National Park. Park Service interpreters offer day and evening programs.

WINTER OPERATION (October-May) offers food and gifts, open daily, weather permitting. Cross-country ski rentals available Thanksgiving to early April.

LODGING: available June to early September. Reservations accepted year-round.

Easy Scenic Access

To CRATER LAKE, follow Highway 62 from Medford on I-5. From Klamath Falls, take Highway 97 north, leading to Highway 62. Southbound on Highway 97 take Highway 138 to Crater Lake north entrance.

To OREGON CAVES, follow REDWOOD HIGHWAY 199 from Grants Pass on I-5 or Crescent City on Coast Highway 101, to Cave Junction.

Oregon's First National Monument

Oregon Caves has more to offer than guided cave tours. Oregon Caves Chateau is a unique landmark in Southern Oregon. Step inside and experience its nostalgic charm. The Chateau is a beautiful rustic building rising six floors above the canyon floor and blending with the forest and the moss-covered marble ledges. Built in 1934, it still retains its relaxing atmosphere and charm that receives countless compliments each year. Enjoy the views of Cave Creek Canyon, waterfalls or the Cave entrance from the guest rooms. In the evening enjoy the huge marble fireplace and dine in one of Southern Oregon's better restaurants. Cave Creek, running through the dining room, adds to its unique atmosphere. The Chateau operates mid-June through early September.

Cave tours are conducted year-round except Thanksgiving and Christmas days. Tours are led by National Park Service trained interpreters. The tour is both educational and entertaining. Visitors will leave the Cave with a better understanding of its geologic and natural history. The Cave is 41 degrees F.; warm clothing and good walking shoes are recommended. By federal regulation children under the age of six are not permitted. A child care service is provided.

Forest Service campgrounds are nearby.
