**Split Rock Creek State Park** (15-minute drive from Pipestone on MN-23 W)

Lake, hiking, etc. Outdoor recreation.

Bison herd, trails, rock climbing, etc. Education and recreation.

**Redwood Falls Ramsey Park** (90-minutes from Pipestone on MN-23 E to Hwy19 Blvd.)

Waterfall, hiking, zoo, camping, etc.

Childhood home of Laura Ingalls Wilder during the 1870s.

**Jeffers Petroglyphs** (80-minute drive from Pipestone along MN-30 E)

Home to over 5,000 petroglyphs spanning 7,000 years.

**Good Earth State Park** ( 1-hour drive from Pipestone)

One of the oldest sites of long-term human habitation in the U.S. and where the Oneota culture lived while utilizing the pipestone quarries for over 300 years.
