Barnum Brown of the American Museum of Katurel History says: "Near Rock Springs, Byoming, are found the largest tracks of dinosaurs so far discovered--larger than could have been made by any dinosaur known from skeleton."

"Days in the Painted Desert and the San Francisco Mountains," by Harold S. Colton and Frank C. Baxter, 1932, page 63: "Dinosaur Canyon, fourteen miles southeast, can be reached from Cameron. As the trail is poorly marked, it is wise to procure a guide.

"Dinosaur Canyon was discovered by Hubert Richardson in 1928. In 1929 a party from the American Museum of Natural History under Barnum Brown and Cilbert Gable visited the site and gave it great publicity.

"Dinosaur Canyon lies in the wingate sandstone at the base of a great escarpment composed of Navajo sandstone. Curious erosion figures stand about. On a slab of white calcareous sandstone. dozens of footprints of three-toed biped dinosaurs are preserved.

"A trip to Dinosaur Canyon in the late afternoon when the setting sum sets fire to the red cliffs is one of the memorable occasions in a lifetime." Legislation proposed prior to the 71st Congress, but did not pass and was not renewed at the 71st Congress:


