Dear Mr. Wilson:

Thank you for your letter of Jamery 5 impulling about the feasibility and possibility of establishing the San Diego as a national historic site. We appreciate the newspaper displays on the San Diego which you so kindly sent with your letter.

The National Park Service is presently conducting a nationwide study entitled the National Servey of Historic Sites and Suddings under the provisions of the Rictoric Sites Apt of August 21, 1935 (49 Stat. 666). The purpose of this Study is to identify these historic sites throughout the country which qualify for national recognition, and as each study of a theme or period of history is completed it is presented to the Advisory Board on National Parks. Historic Sites, Buildings, and Monuments for consideration, as provided for by the Historic Sites Act. The Advisory Board is composed of entent private authorities who advice the Separary of the Enterior on questions of national historical significance and other park matters.

When the Advisory Brand considered the there study entitled "Spanish Exploration and Nottlement" it considered the specific sites of San Diego Presidio and Old San Diego. The board recognized that the Presidio had significant historic values and recommended it be made a Registered National Historic Landmark, which was subsequently done. However, it did not consider Old San Diego as having exceptional historical values. These decisions were reached at their both meeting, held April 20-22, 1959.

Historic sites and buildings established as units of the National Pank System must be judged to pessens detional historical significance and to neet standards of suffability and resultability for park purposes as well. Legislatics by Congress is ordinarily pentired to authorize the establishment of areas siminfatored by the National Park Service.

In view of the action by the Advisory Board, we believe Old San Diego appears to be more suitable for preservation through community and state efforts, than for recommendation and development on the national level by the Federal Covernment. In many cases, the strongest supportors of commutity projects are the state preservation agencies and the state and been historical erganizations. This certainly appears to be the case regarding Old San Diego.

We understand acveral groups have been salting strong efforts toward preserving the old town. The local historic groups have been quite active, being sparred on particularly by the ladies of the Junior League. The success of their efforts will be best breight about by the actions of the local governing bodies. Judging by the newspaper article, preservation has apparently been given tangitle support by the San Diego County Board of Supervisors. State bely appears to be in the offing.

As you probably know, there is considerable local discussion over how old San Diego will be preserved and in what form. We hope that the local groups which have long been interested in the preservation of the old town, will be able to reach a sobriton matually expecable to thes and insure the preservation of this site.

We hope the foregoing information will be belocal to you. We appreciate your interest in historic preservation.
