this area in Mississippi was first brought to our attention by Mrs. C. C. Clark through Congressman J. E. Kankin.

In a letter of June 22, 1934, to Congressman mankin from the Director, it was stated that this Service could not take steps toward restoration of the town, and suggested that it be undertaken locally. The attached report from the Fourth Regional Officer of the Branch of Planning and State Cooperation, supports this statement.

From the above statement, with the concurrence of Mr. Lee and Mr. Chatelain, it is assumed that the proposed monument project is subject to disapproval.

It is recommended that this area be disapproved and removed from our active list.
