




First NPS Director Stephen Mather and rangeroons in Yellowstone, 1926. Director Mather is holding an antler shed by one of the park's bull elk.






This calendar is dedicated to the memory of my mother, Alice Murdach Hoofnagle, 1914-1990.

Rangeroons have been appearing in NPS employee publications since 1973. Although Rangeroons are very shy, the 75th anniversary of the National Park Service was an occasion that they could not overlook. This marks their first appearance in public and you can expect to see more of them in the future.

Keith is a career employee with the NPS and has served at Olympic, Saguaro, Yellowstone, Harper's Ferry, and Hawaii Volcanos. Currently he works for the Alaska Regional Office in Anchorage as an illustrator and visual information specialist.

Born and raised in Washington state, Keith's favorite park is Olympic, "but I've never been to a national park I didn't like," he quickly adds.



Who are the Rangeroons?

Park people have known about Rangeroons for a long, long time—since national parks began. Rangeroons are inquisitive little characters, pure of heart, shy and generally lovable. They're small, a little larger than a wood duck, and can be a nuisance when they get underfoot or remind us of things we would rather forget.

I've never actually met a Rangeroon, but I know they are there—just as Harvey was there for Elwood P. Dowd. They are imaginative characters, always showing up at the right time to lend a hand and to remind us what national parks and park people are all about.

They have a distinct dislike for bureaucracy and technology—making few concessions to either. They want to be near the real people where the real work is being done. They tend to avoid central offices, but I'm hoping they'll spend more time there because those folks need help too.

Rangeroons tend to be a bit shy around

park visitors except for the children and are much more comfortable with rangers and other park employees. They are completely dedicated to national parks and the ideals parks represent. Recently they've broadened their interests to cover a host of environmental concerns including clean air, clean water, and recycling. They're not sure what all the talk about biodiversity is, but they're for that too.

Rangeroons have been in Yellowstone since I872 when the world's first national park was created by an Act of Congress. Those of us who live in Yellowstone can't imagine what it would be like without them. I hope that when you're traveling in your national parks that you'll be on the lookout for Rangeroons. They are worth getting to know.
