



Namekagon River Map & Information Guide

River Section 3: Trego to Riverside Landing

This river map and guide provides information for the 39.5 mile section of the Namekagon River between Trego and Riverside Landing. Have a safe and enjoyable trip!

🌊 **Personal Floatation Devices (PFDs) are required** onboard for each passenger on all vessels. **Children under the age of 13 must wear a properly fitting PFD** while in moving vessels.

🌊 Water levels change. It is dangerous and **illegal to jump from bridges, cliffs or trees** into the river.

🌊 **Carry out all trash.** Bring trash bags with you.

🌊 **Open fires** are permitted only in steel fire rings or grills. Dead and down wood may be collected for firewood except from islands. Possession of firewood that originates from a source more than 50 miles from the Riverway is prohibited. Fires must be out and ashes cold before you leave the area.

🌊 **Camping** is permitted in designated sites only. **There is a 3-night limit of stay.** Most campsites accommodate 3 tents. Group sites accommodate up to 6 tents.

🌊 **Primitive toilets** are available at campsites and landings. At river areas without toilets, bury human waste 6 inches deep and at least 100 feet away from river and campsites.



The black sandshell mussel is a species of concern in Wisconsin.

It is illegal to collect or disturb freshwater mussels or their shells.

🌊 Avoid **overhanging trees** in the river. They can overturn vessels and trap paddlers underwater.

🌊 Construction on the **Highway 35 bridge** at Riverside Landing has begun. A short portage around the bridge may be required during some phases of construction. The area downstream of the bridge will be closed for use as a staging area. Facilities including campsites, restrooms and water will remain open on the upstream side of the bridge.

🌊 **Deer ticks** found along the river can carry Lyme disease. Check often for ticks and know the symptoms of the disease.

🌊 **Drinking water** is provided at some landings. See reverse for locations. River water must be treated to protect against giardia. **Glass containers** are prohibited on lands and waters within the Riverway.



Rapids on this stretch of river are usually classified as Class 1, the easiest class.
