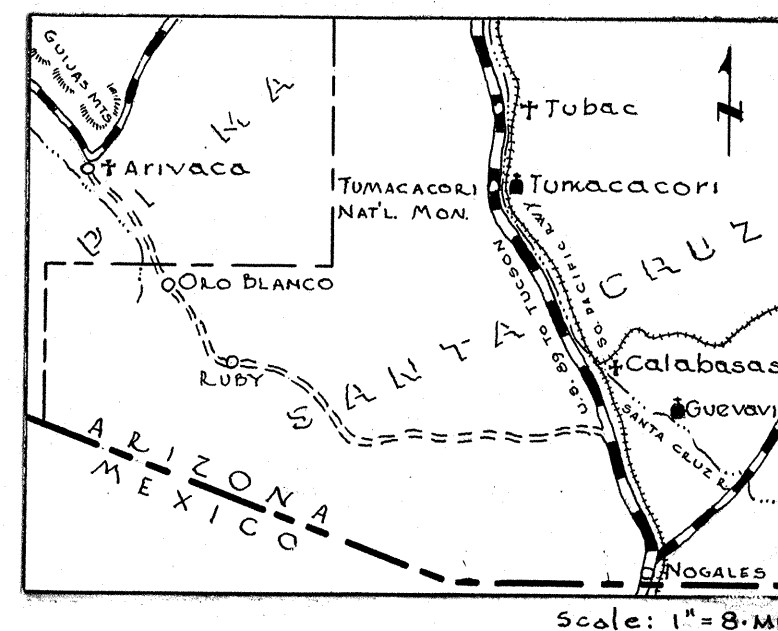
Additional Data: When the Jesuits were expelled in 1767, the
Franciscans took over their missions and renamed
Guevavi. "San Miguel de Guevavi" and "San Rafael
de Guevavi" were also names used during the Jesuit
period. The common name of the Franciscan period
was "Santos Angeles". (The form "Guebavi" was also
used.)

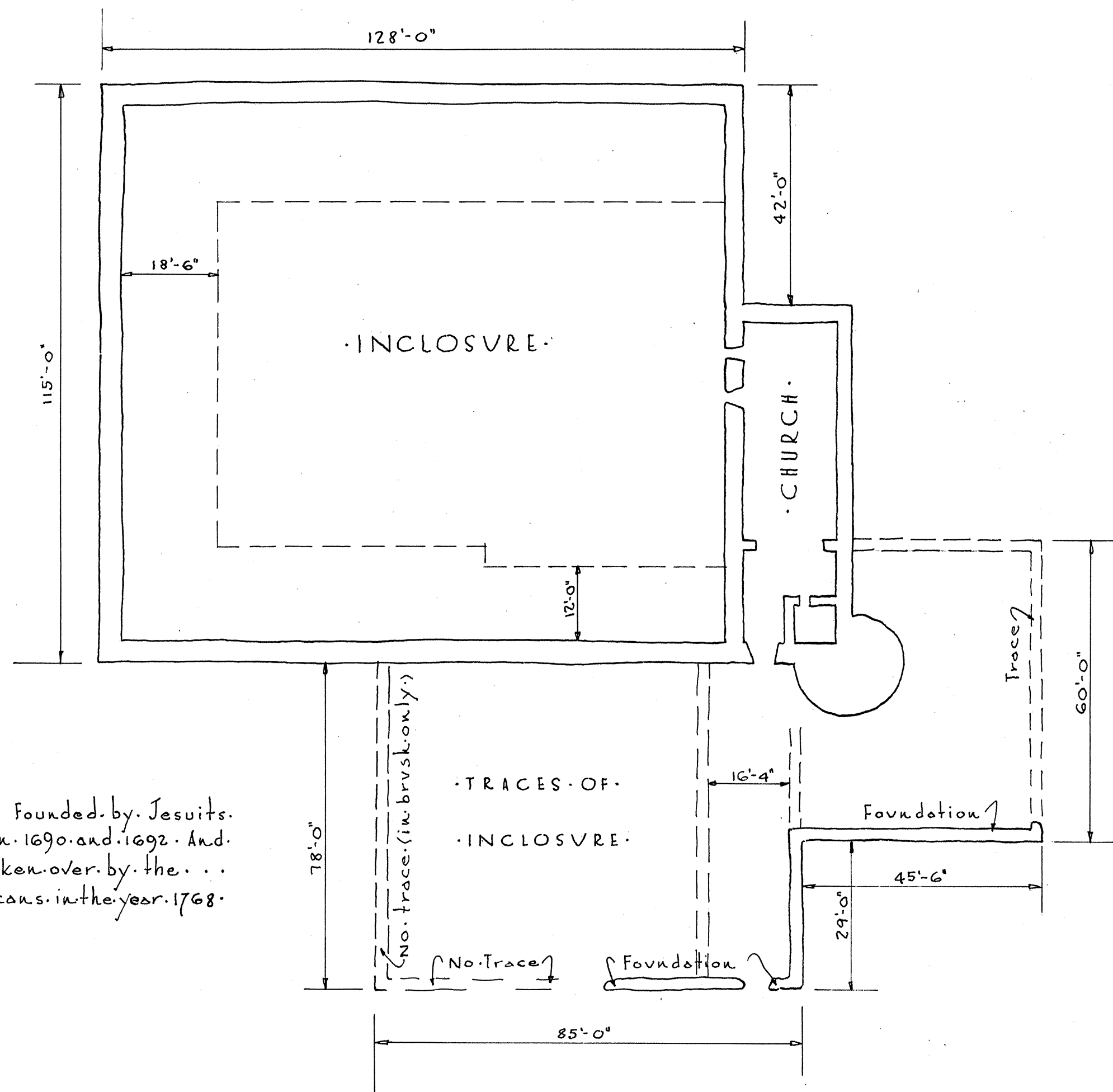

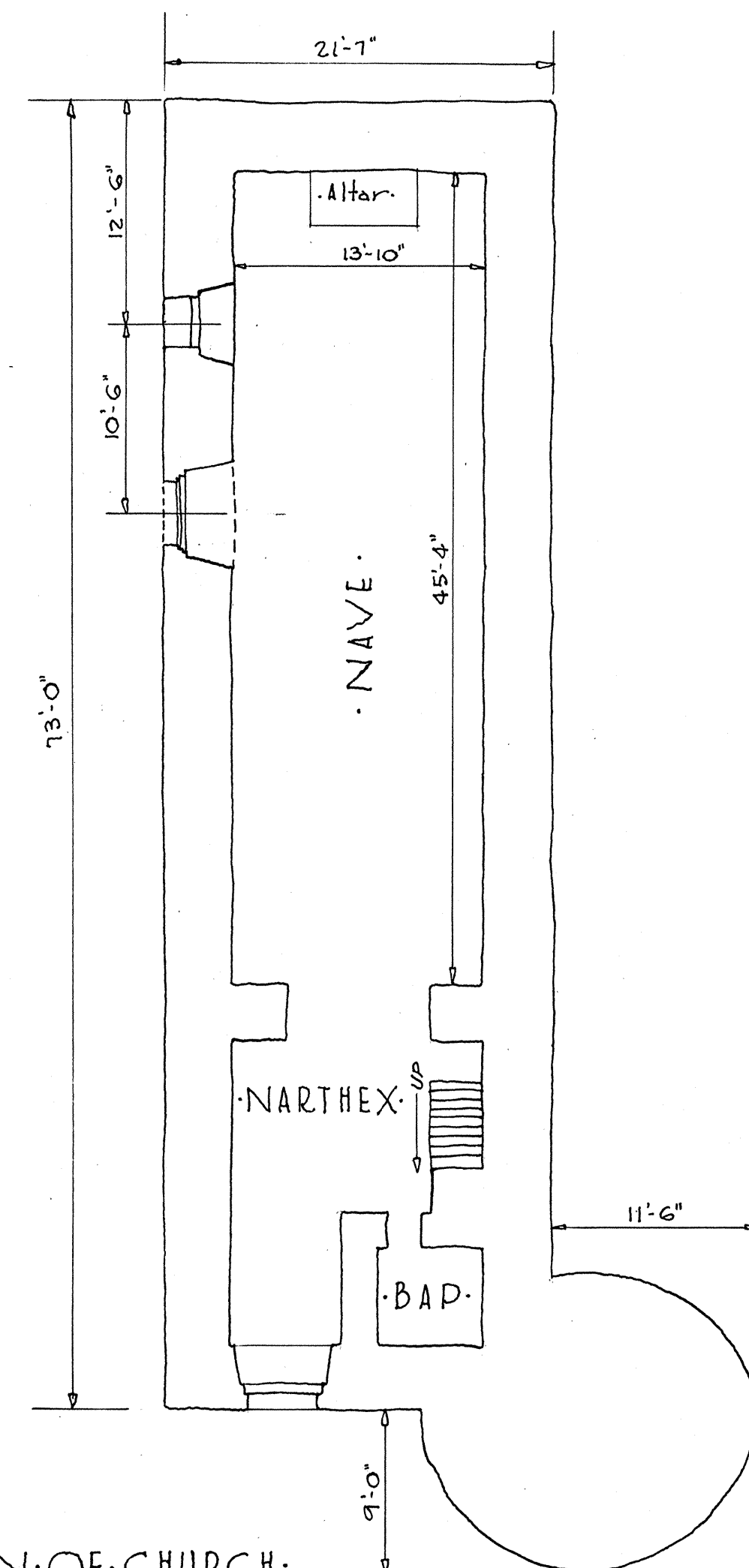

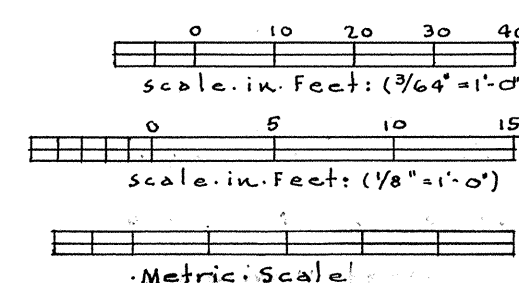
