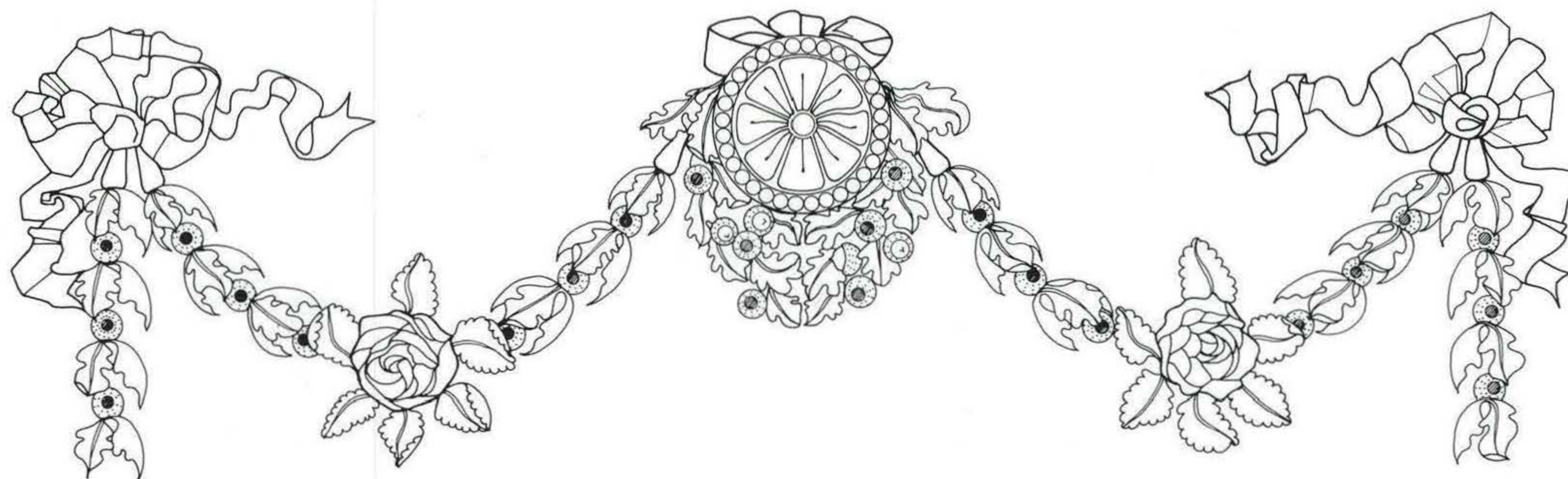


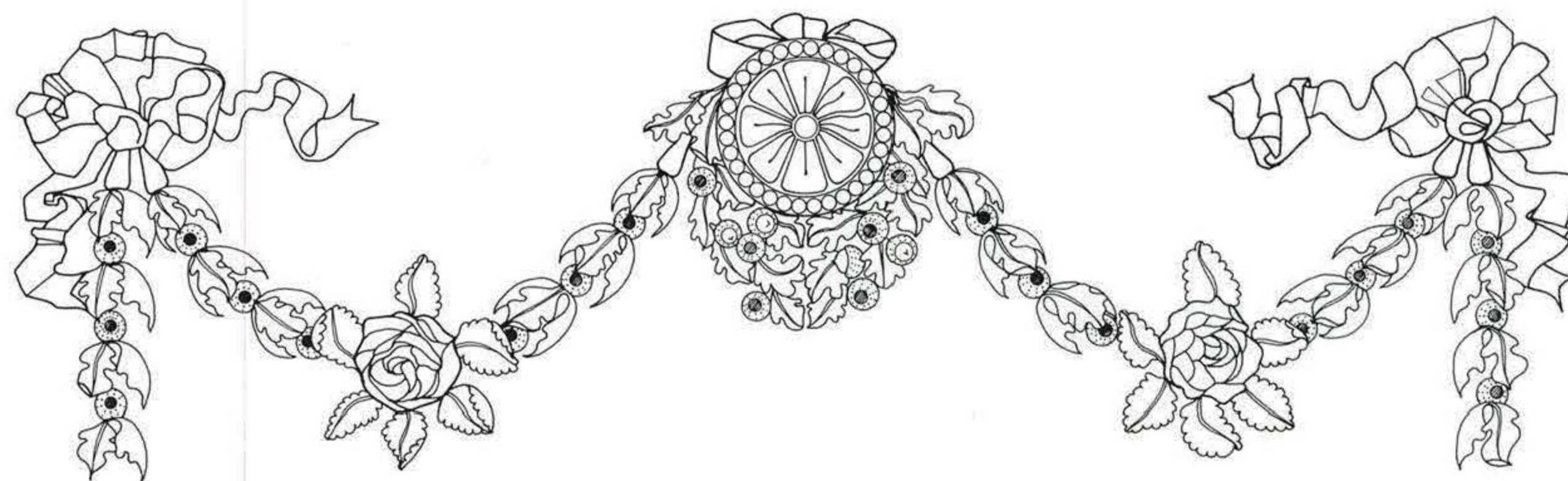

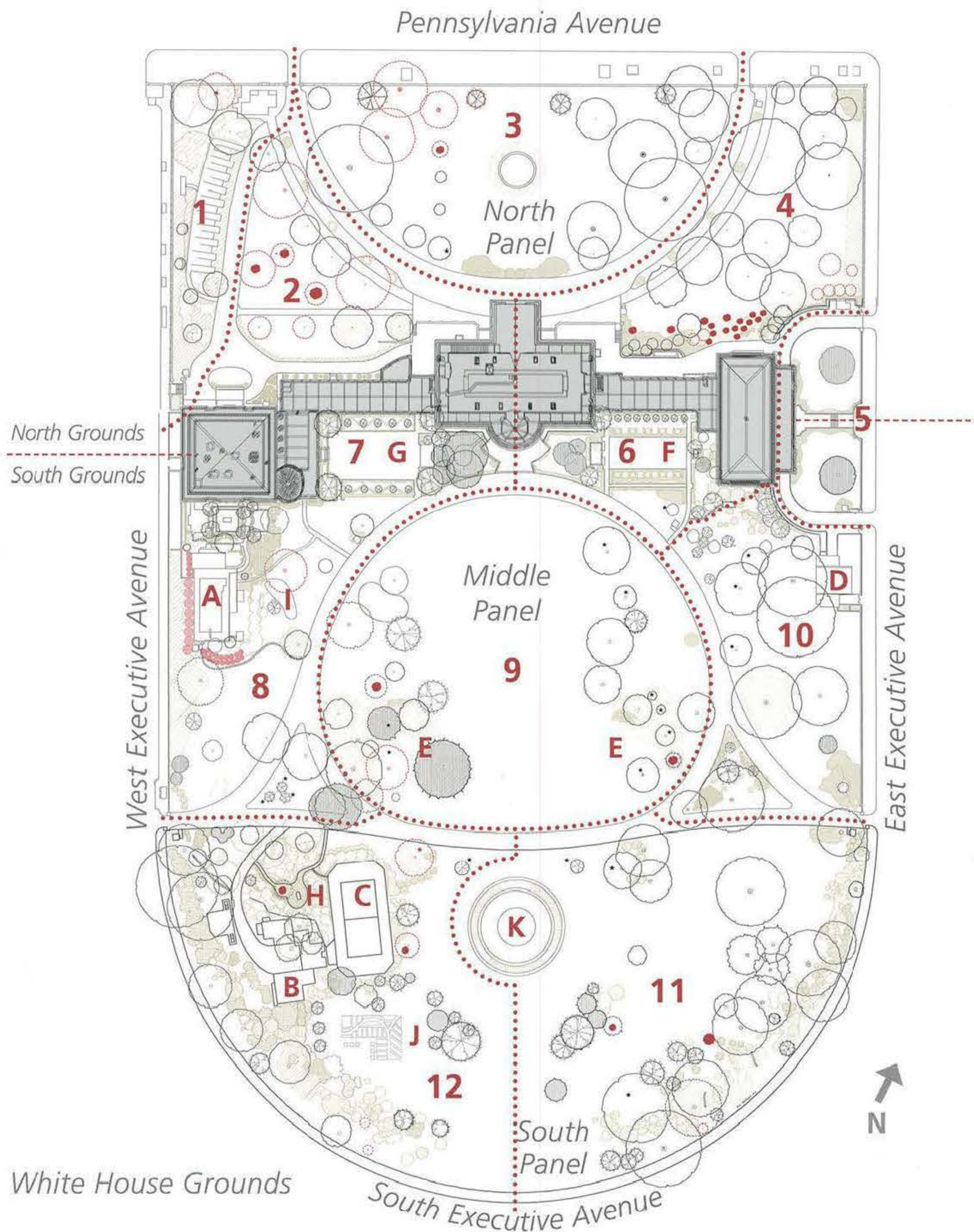
Preface

The White House grounds and gardens are a living monument. The landscape character has evolved through many administrations, covering more than 200 years. These grounds and gardens change with the seasons and are continually improved by human hands.

It is, therefore, important to document for future generations one of the most famous gardens in the world. This booklet records for posterity the image of the White House grounds during 2009-2012, in the first term of the Barack H. Obama administration. It supplements previous volumes published for 1976-1980, 1980-1984, 1984-1988, 1988-1992, 1992-1996, 1996-2000, 2000-2004, 2004-2008.

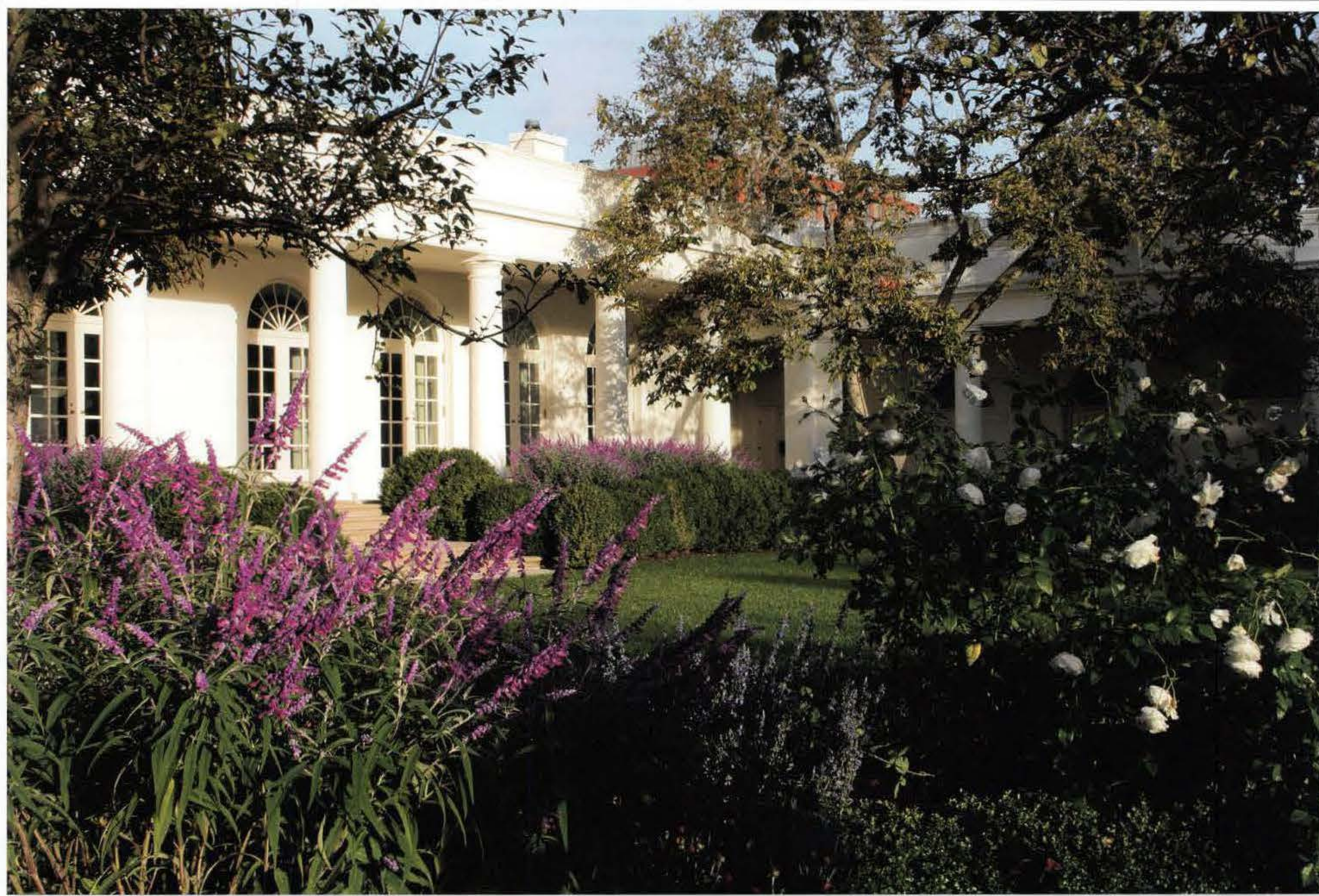

The White House Grounds

2009 - 2012

North Grounds

- 2009 A scarlet oak, *Quercus coccinea*, planted in 2008 by President Bush, was removed after it did not survive transplanting. Section 4 / Tree 1
- An American chestnut hybrid, *Castanea x hybrida*, planted in 2006 by President Bush, was removed after it never took to the planting site. Section 4 / Tree 8
- A fern-leaf beech, *Fagus sylvatica* 'Asplenifolia,' planted in 1980, was removed due to decline. Section 4 / Tree 15
- 2010 Several trees were removed for a General Services Administration (GSA) utility upgrade project. Trees were replaced in-kind after each phase of the project was finished.
- An American elm, *Ulmus americana* (JQA Graft*), planted in 1998, was dug and planted off-site for the GSA construction project. Section 1 / Tree 5
- A sugar maple, *Acer saccharum*, planted in 1984 by President Reagan, was removed for the GSA construction project. Section 1 / Tree 7

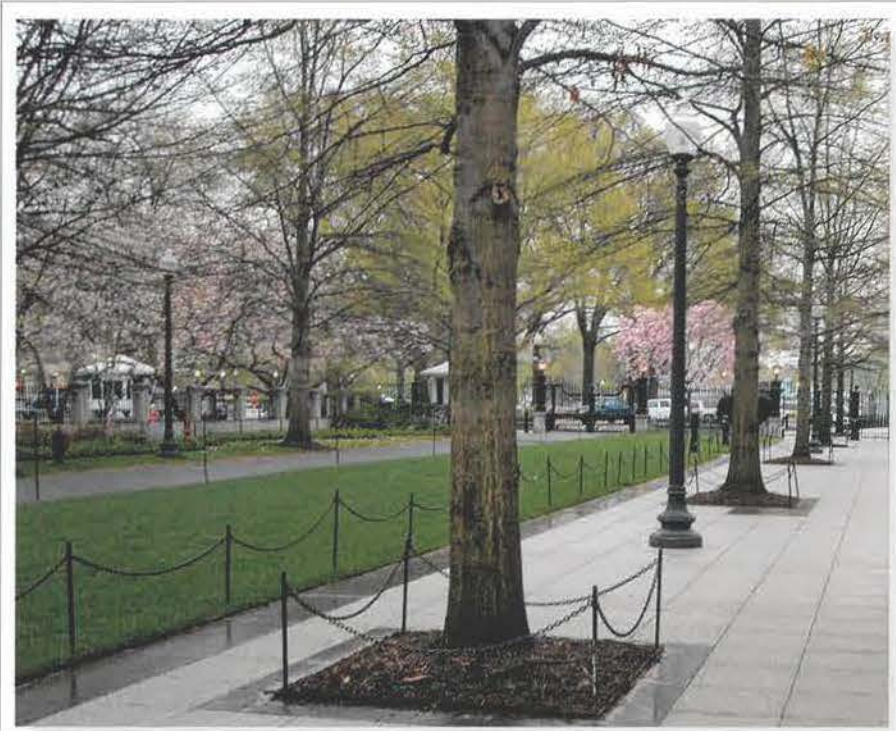

- An American elm, *Ulmus americana* 'Washington,' planted in 1998, was removed for the GSA construction project. It was replaced with an American Elm, *Ulmus americana*, in November 2012. Section 1 / Tree 6
- A littleleaf linden, *Tilia cordata*, planted in 1979, was removed for the GSA construction project. It was replaced in-kind in November 2012. Section 2 / Tree 3
- A pin oak, *Quercus palustris*, planted in 1963, was removed for the GSA construction project. It was replaced in-kind in November 2012. Section 2 / Tree 4
- A fern-leaf beech, *Fagus sylvatica* 'Asplenifolia,' planted in 1986, was removed for the GSA construction project. Section 2 / Tree 8
- A fern-leaf beech, *Fagus sylvatica* 'Asplenifolia,' planted in 2006, was removed for the GSA construction project. Section 2 / Tree 9
- A sugar maple, *Acer saccharum*, planted in 1979, was removed for the GSA construction project. It was replaced in-kind in November 2012. Section 2 / Tree 10

- A star magnolia, *Magnolia stellata*, planted in 1952, was removed due to snow damage. Section 4 / Tree 23
- A star magnolia, *Magnolia stellata*, planted in 1952, was removed due to snow damage. Section 4 / Tree 24
- 2011 A hybrid elm tree, *Ulmus x hybrida* (NPS 3), planted in 1982, was damaged due to a strong thunderstorm on July 4. The tree was removed on July 5. Section 2 / Tree 11
- A horse chestnut tree, *Aesculus hippocastanum*, planted before 1900, was damaged during a thunderstorm on July 4 and was removed on July 6. Section 3 / Tree 4
- 2012 An American elm tree, *Ulmus americana*, planted in 1975 by Mrs. Betty Ford, had to be removed on May 25 due to Dutch elm disease. Section 2 / Tree 5
- The long-declining purple beech tree, *Fagus sylvatica* 'Atropunicea,' planted before 1900, had to be removed on July 24, due to poor health. Section 1 / Tree 1



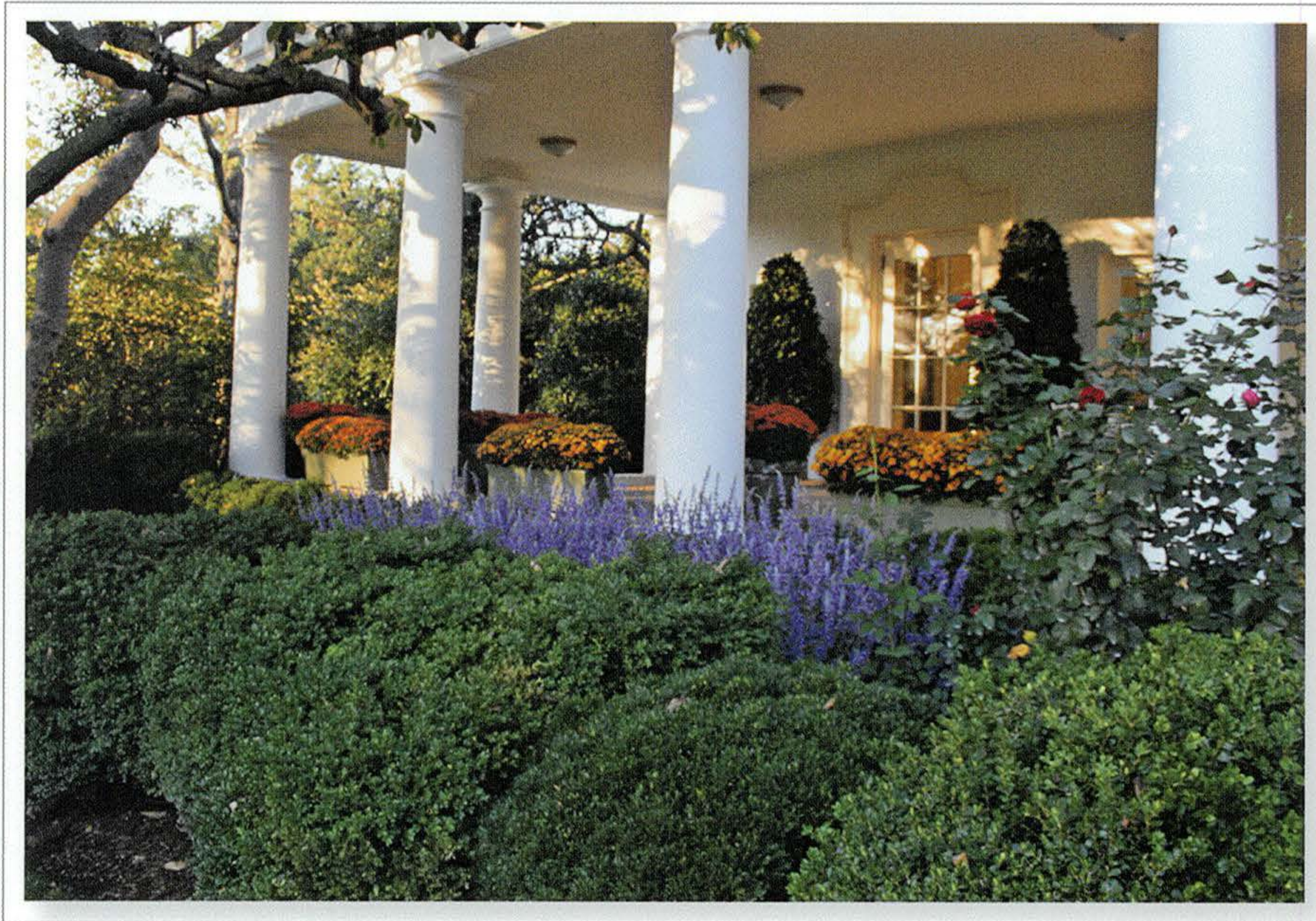

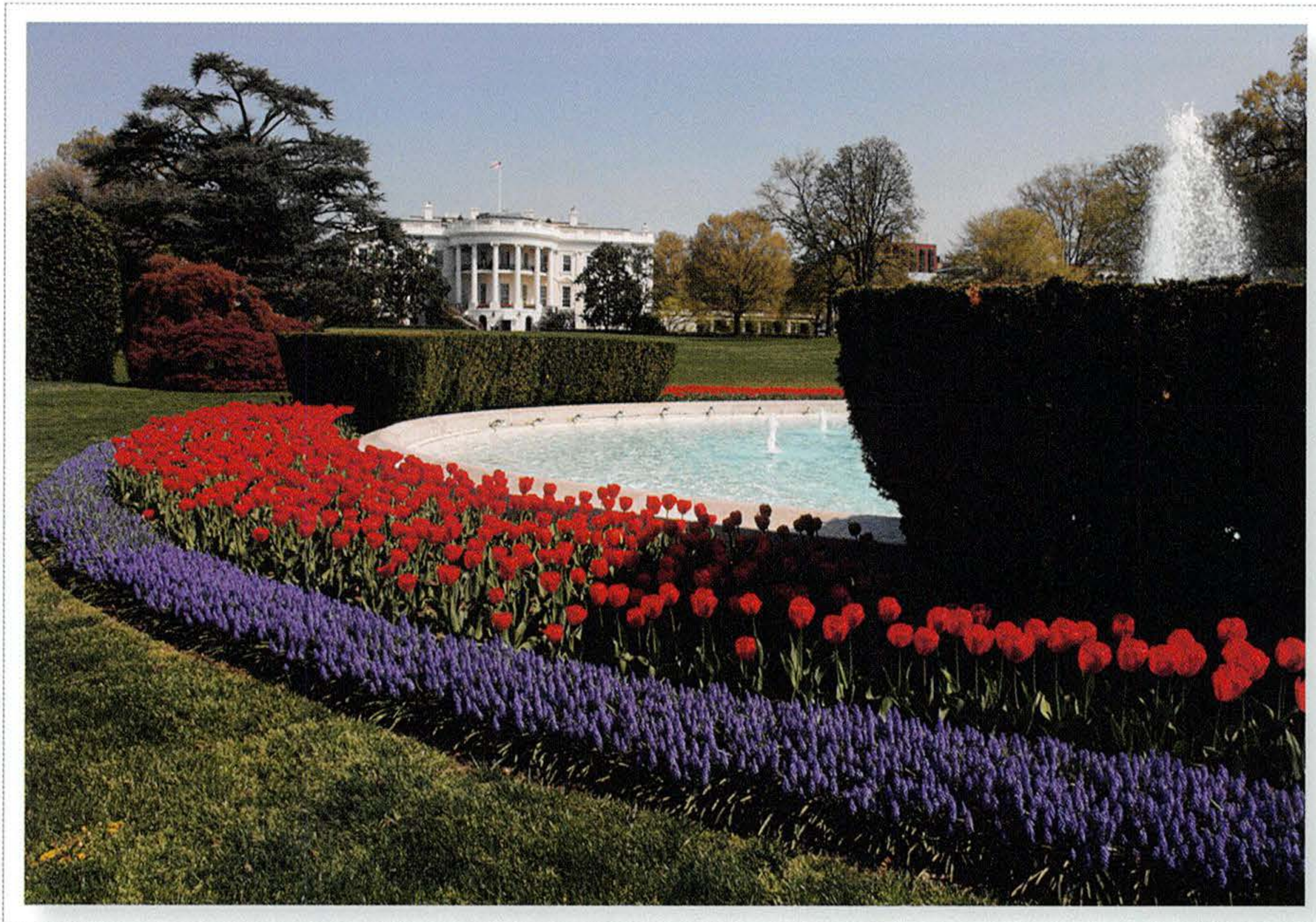
South Grounds

- 2009 No trees were planted or removed during 2009.
- 2010 2010 was a very difficult year for the White House Grounds. February brought two snowstorms. The first, occurring February 5–6, was called “Snowmageddon.” The storm dropped 20–35 inches of snow across the Washington, DC, area and damaged many trees on the grounds. A second snowstorm occurred February 9–10 and also pummeled the DC area with 10–20 inches of snow.
- A Katherine crabapple tree, *Malus* ‘Katherine,’ planted in 1963, was lost due to snow damage in February. Section 7 / Tree 12
- A horse chestnut tree, *Aesculus hippocastanum*, planted prior to 1900, near the South Grounds fence line, was lost due to snow damage in February. Section 11 / Tree 23
- The Red Delicious apple tree, *Malus domestica*, planted in the Children’s Garden in 1986, was lost due to snow damage in February. It was replaced in kind in November. Section 12 / Tree 9
- Snow damage claimed a lily-flowering magnolia tree, *Magnolia quinquepeta*, planted in 1952. It was removed in February. Section 12 / Tree 33



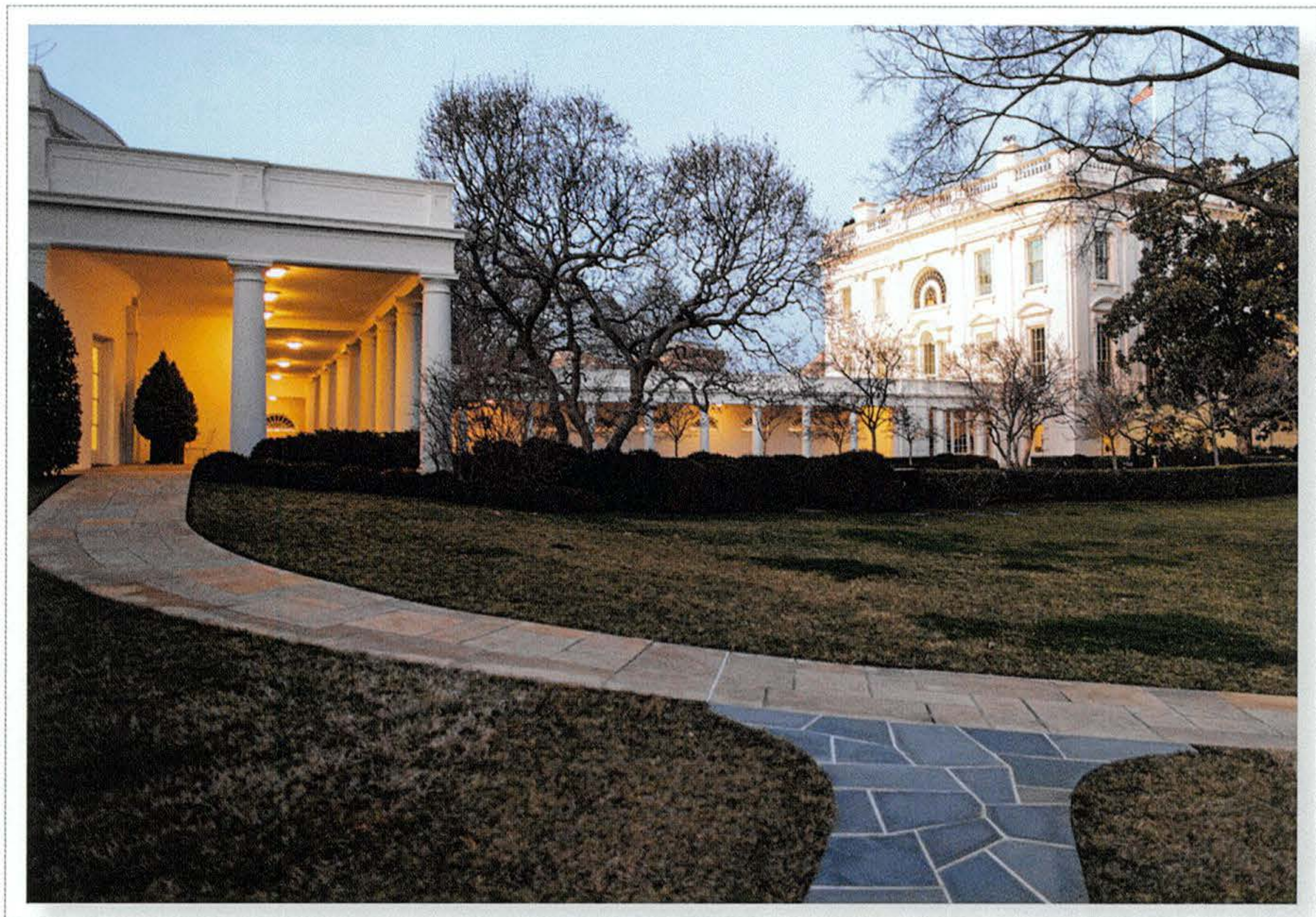

- The spring-flowering Cornelian cherry tree, *Cornus mas*, succumbed to damage by winter snowstorms. It was removed on April 12. It was replaced in kind in April 2012. Section 9 / Tree 9
- On June 14, a red maple tree, *Acer rubrum*, planted prior to 1900, was removed due to a decline in health. The tree was replaced with a live oak tree (Emancipation Oak) on June 22. The Emancipation Oak was given to President Obama by the President of Hampton University, Dr. William Harvey, on the occasion of President Obama delivering the commencement address to its graduating class on May 9. Section 9 / Tree 19
- A fern leaf beech tree, *Fagus sylvatica* ‘Asplenifolia,’ planted prior to 1900, suffered decline and was removed August 25. Section 9 / Tree 13
- The pin oak tree, *Quercus palustris*, planted in 1958 by President Eisenhower, was removed on October 21. The tree had been in a state of declining health for some time. It was deemed not structurally sound due to a hollow trunk. Section 8 / Tree 6
- An English elm, *Ulmus procera*, planted prior to 1900, was removed due to declining health November 8. Section 8 / Tree 8
- A flowering dogwood, *Cornus florida*, planted in 1977, was removed due to decline. Section 12 / Tree 17

- 2011 A Washington American elm tree, *Ulmus americana* ‘Washington,’ planted by President Clinton in 1993, had to be removed on March 21, as it became structurally hazardous. Section 12 / Tree 2
- A Loebner magnolia tree, *Magnolia x loebneri* ‘Merrill,’ was planted during March. Section 12 / Tree 33
- A Winter King hawthorne, *Crataegus viridis* ‘Winter King,’ planted in 2005, was replaced with a new one after the snow damage it received in 2010 could not be corrected. Section 7 / Tree 5
- A Katherine crabapple, *Malus* ‘Katherine,’ planted in 1963, was removed due to decline. Section 12 / Tree 18
- 2012 The autumn Higan Cherry tree, planted in 1979, was removed on February 27, 2012 due to its decline in health. It was replaced by a Yoshino Cherry tree on February 28, 2012. Section 11 / Tree 35
- A flowering dogwood, *Cornus florida*, planted in 1931, was removed due to decline. Section 11 / Tree 25
- In March the Leyland cypress, *Cupressocyparis leylandii*, that screened the pool area were declining and removed. Section 8 / Tree 29. They were replaced with a combination of Leyland cypress, *Cupressocyparis leylandii*, Section 8 / Tree 27 and Green Giant arborvitae, *Thuja* ‘Green Giant,’ Section 8 / Tree 26

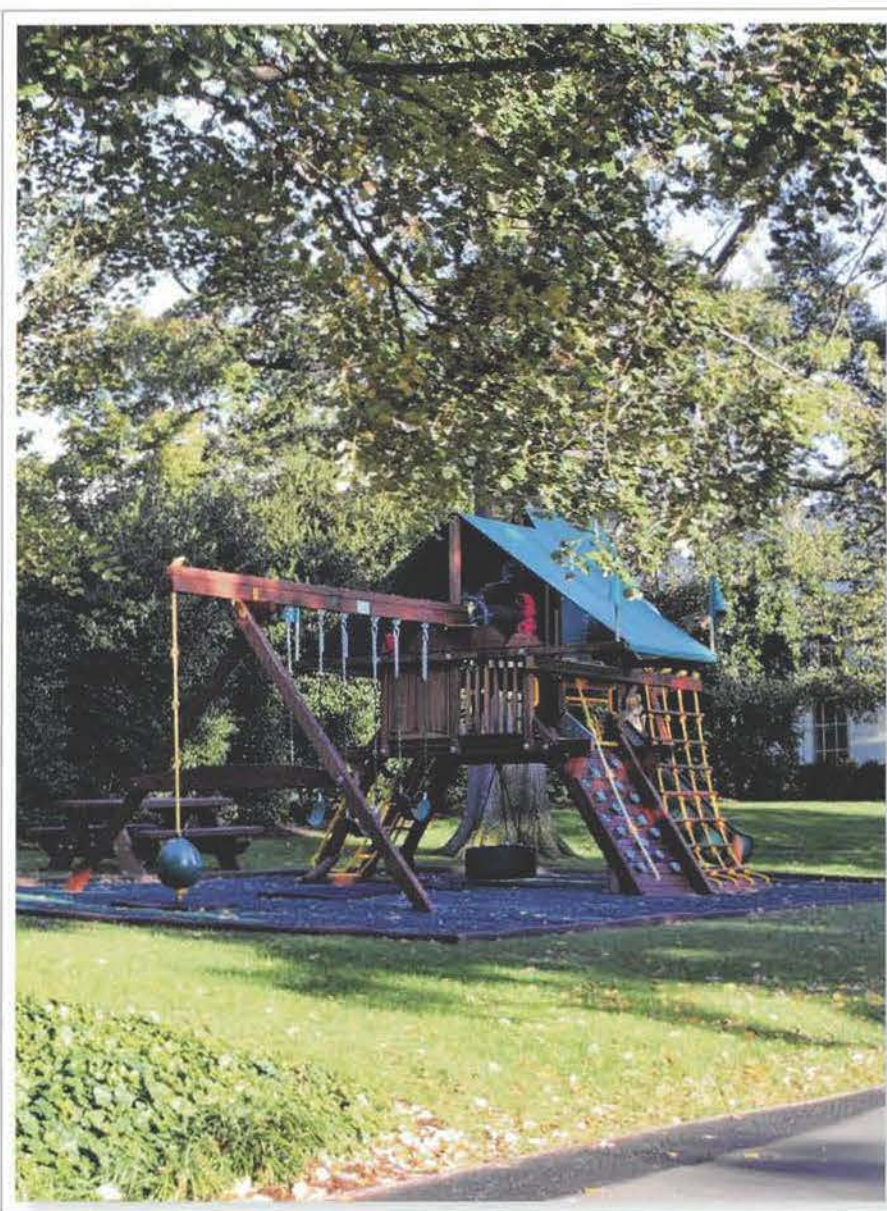

Swing Set

Many first families add personal touches to the house or grounds to make the White House feel more like a home. In March, President and Mrs. Obama purchased a swing set for their daughters, Malia and Sasha. The set contains three swings, a tire swing, a fort, a slide, a climbing wall, and climbing ropes. It was situated on the South Grounds in view of the Oval Office. After installation, the National Park Service installed rubber mulch flooring under the swing set for safety.

White House Kitchen Garden

The first plans for a kitchen garden on the White House grounds dates back to Thomas Jefferson; however, the first written documentation of a vegetable garden being installed on the grounds was by John Quincy Adams in 1825. The last vegetable garden was planted in the 1940s when First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt guided the planting of a “victory garden” in a flower bed south of the East Garden. To the delight of many, First Lady Michelle Obama requested the assistance of the National Park Service to install a kitchen garden on the South Grounds. On March 20, the First Lady, with the assistance of local schoolchildren, broke ground, and April 9 was the first planting day. Since then, the garden has provided fresh, seasonal produce for the First Family and White House guests to enjoy. The garden is used to educate American children about the importance of eating more vegetables and fruits as part of a healthier lifestyle.

The first year, the garden consisted of low-raised beds, along with two square, raised wood planter boxes. There was a bluestone stepping stone pathway through the garden. In 2010, it increased in size with the creation of more tilled earth garden beds. A second bluestone walkway path was added, as well as four additional wood raised planter boxes. The spring of 2011 brought a dramatic change. The National Park Service, along with the Residence Staff, placed the entire garden into wood raised planting beds. This enabled the beds to be level, making watering more efficient and walking paths better defined.

Seal Coat North Grounds Roadway

Over the years, several pavement patches were made to the North Grounds roadway. These patches gave a poor aesthetic appearance, as each patch was a different shade of black. The last asphalt patch was done in 2009 after a leak beneath the pavement was repaired. The patches also left joints that required filling. Concerned for the longevity and the appearance of the pavement, the entire north driveway was seal coated. Two coats of an asphalt base sealed the pavement and the joints in October.

Resurface Basketball Court

In 2009, it was decided that the basketball court needed to be restored, due to the deterioration of the playing surface. Surface damage, caused by the movement of the heavy basketball backstops across the court surface for storage, spoiled the court surface. In addition, the moving of backstops required a great deal of manpower. Working with the Usher's Office, the National Park Service staff reviewed the current deficiencies and suggested ways to correct the problem. In 2010, two new concrete backstop storage areas were constructed at each end of the court. The storage area eliminated the need for moving the backstops on the court surface, thus protecting the court playing surface. Associated improvements included new fencing, new court surface, striping, and new plantings around the court.



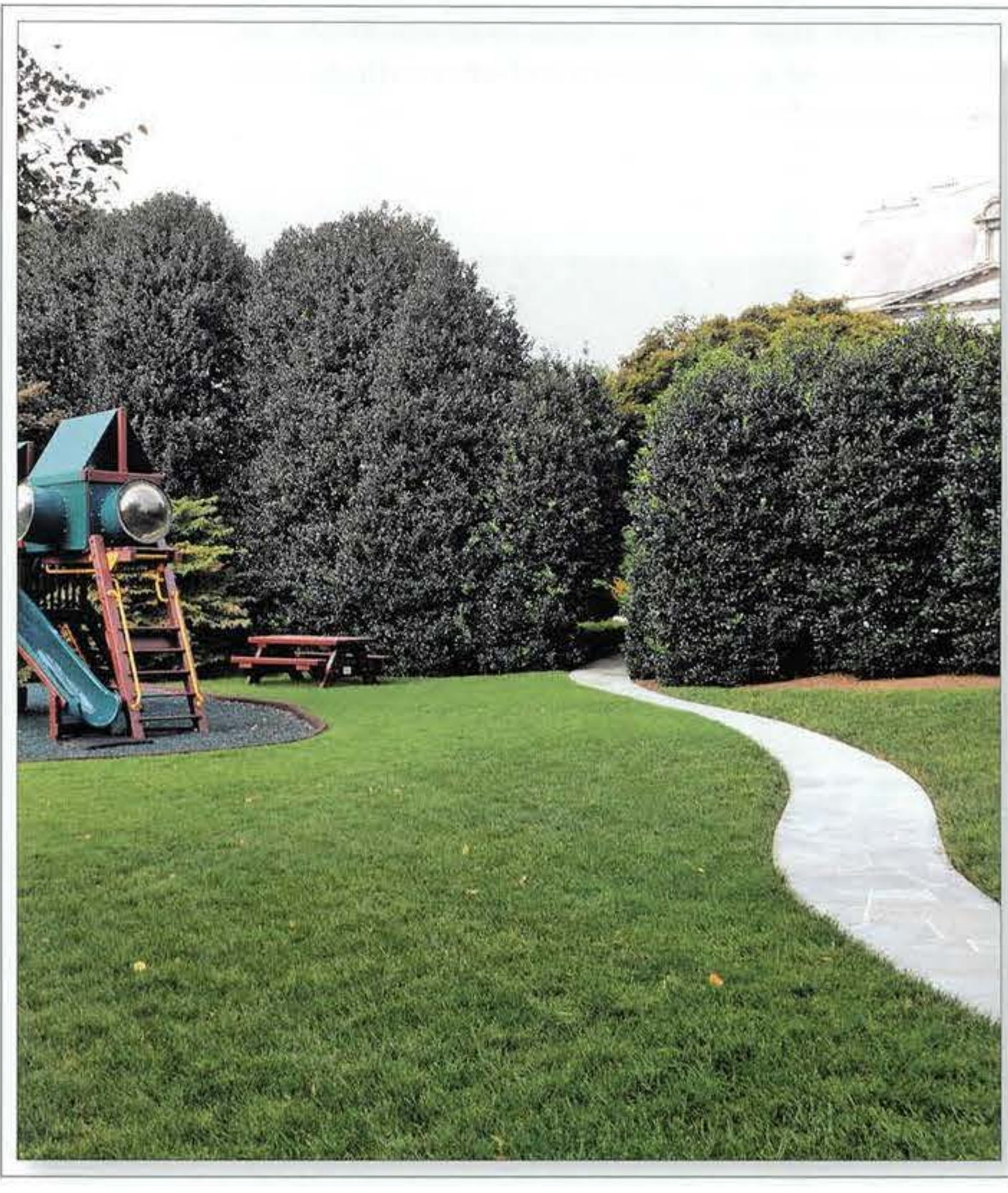

New Swimming Pool Walkway

With high pedestrian traffic, the existing stepping stones to the pool area were not suited to the needs of the First Family and Residence Staff. The stepping stones were difficult to traverse and became muddy in times of rain or lawn irrigation. A hardscape walkway was needed to correct the difficulties.

A firm walking surface was achieved with Pennsylvania flagstone pavers, set on a concrete base for durability and longevity. A curvilinear alignment was used to mimic the old stepping stones, and a random angular stone pattern was designed to complement the walks in the pool area and to contrast the walk to the Oval Office. On the path to the driving range area, stepping stones were set in stone dust for future flexibility.



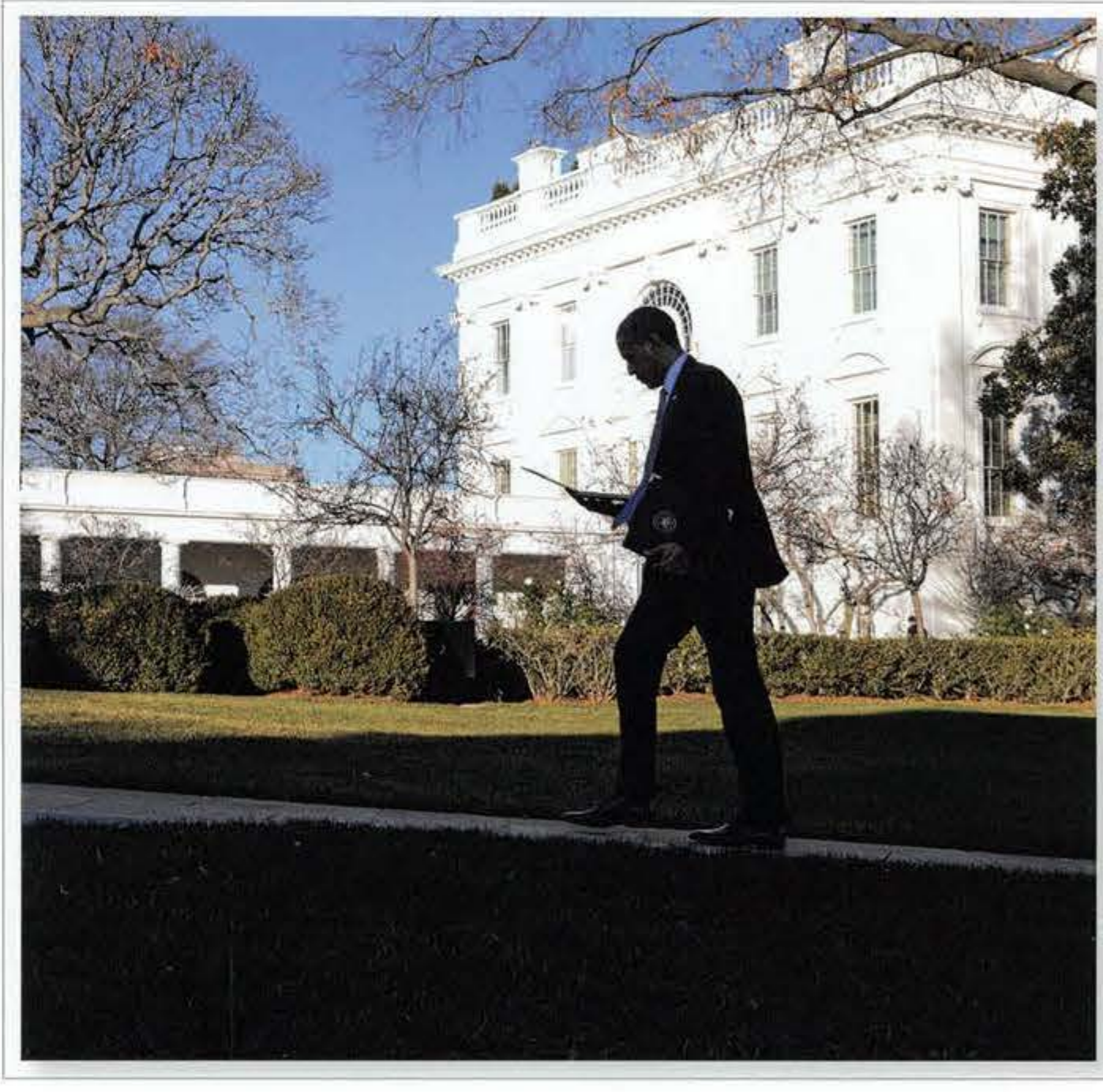

Painting of the White House

The White House masonry structure dates to the late 18th century, while the windows likely date to the first quarter of the 19th century, installed after the residence had been burned by the British in 1814. The masonry walls are constructed of Aquia Creek sandstone and were painted with an acrylic paint. The window sash and jambs are built of a fine grade of mahogany, southern yellow pine, and white oak and exhibit the highest level of craftsmanship.

In 2012, the overall condition of the building exterior was very good, having been partially restored and repaired during the past five years. The painting project started with cleaning of the exterior west face of the main residence, followed by the south elevation, east elevation, and finishing with the north elevation. Following the cleaning, inspections were performed, deficiencies addressed, and stone repaired before painting the entire surface. The painting of the main residence took more than ten weeks to complete and required more than 400 gallons of paint.

Restoration of West Executive Avenue

Over the course of various construction projects by multiple agencies, the east sidewalk of West Executive Avenue had become a series of disjointed concrete repairs, which left a noncohesive look. The goal of repairing the sidewalk was to have materials match the west side of West Executive Avenue that is adjacent to the Eisenhower Executive Office Building. Work included the installation of sidewalk pavers, light poles, utility lines, and street trees. The work was performed in conjunction with the restoration of the historic White House fence project.



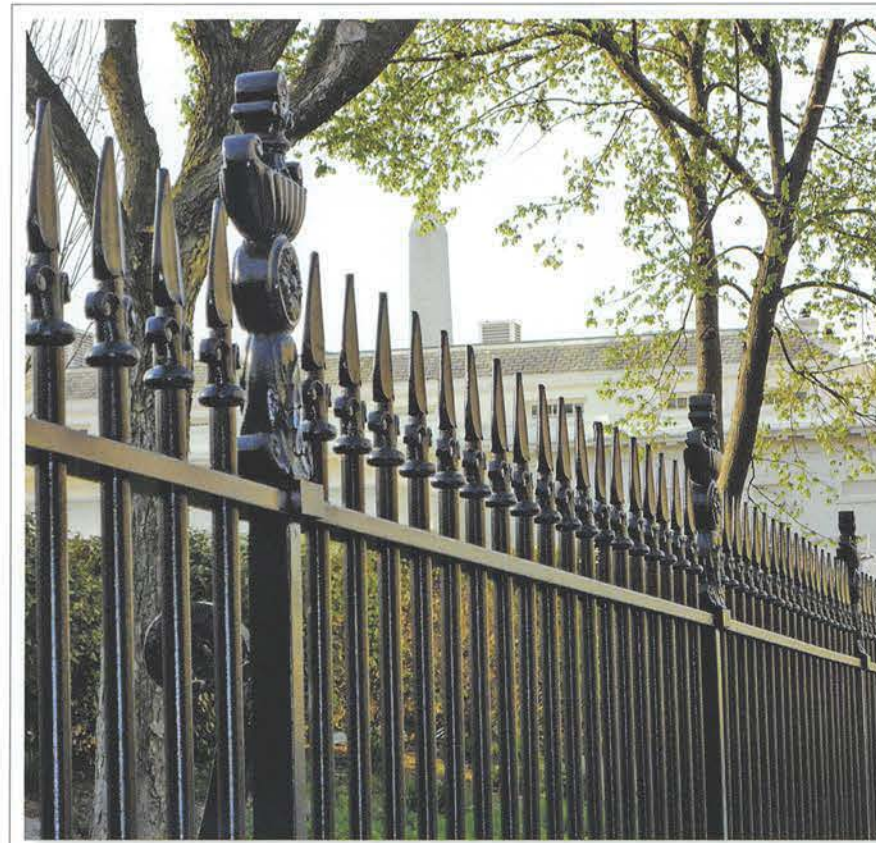

Restoration of the Historic Fence

The fence surrounding the White House grounds spans approximately 3,280 feet and is composed of an iron picket fence atop a short stone base that, in total, stands 7 to 8 feet tall. It consists of approximately 366 fence panels, 11 pedestrian gates, 6 vehicular gates, and 20 masonry piers, dating to the early 19th century, that flank the fence at various locations. Damage, repairs, and alterations have occurred during many presidential administrations. The overall condition of the fence varies and suffers deterioration on all elements, including the ironwork, granite coping stones, base stones, gates, metal hardware, and masonry piers.

A 2010 report documented all the needed repairs. In early 2012, the National Park Service Historic Preservation Training Center started the restoration process. Sections of the metal fence were removed and taken to an off-site facility to remove paint and rust, provide repair, and replace damaged and missing components. While the metal fence was off-site, the granite stone base was repaired using dutchmen and other methods deemed appropriate for preservation.

Reconstruct C-6 Gatehouse

As part of an ongoing effort by the Secret Service to upgrade facilities at the White House, the gatehouse just north of the West Wing was replaced as part of a General Services Administration utility upgrade project. The new structure's overall architectural style, appearance, materials, and finishes are consistent with the Commission of Fine Arts' approved design established for the site. The booth is clad with Indiana limestone with a base plinth of carnelian granite. The roof material is standing seam terne-coated stainless steel.

Restoration of Lamps At North Gate

According to William Easby's Annual Report to the Commission of Public Buildings of February 18, 1853, lanterns were installed on the north side of the White House in 1852. The manufacturer is imprinted on the tops: Jos. Neumann, Phil, PA. The lanterns were removed in 1902 during the Theodore Roosevelt renovation, at which point they were electrified. They have had piecemeal repairs done to them over the years. Due to their age and use, they were in need of comprehensive restoration.

The National Park Service removed, repaired, and reinstalled four lanterns sitting atop gateposts leading from the north driveway to Pennsylvania Avenue. The work included removing paint, conservation and repair of bronze elements, repainting, replacing damaged glass, complete rewiring and replacing electrical components, installing energy efficient light fixtures, and preparing treatment and maintenance reports.
